LATEST ADVICE AND MEASURES IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

- Today, under the guidance of BC’s Health and Emergency Management officials, the Government of BC announced that the provincial state of emergency has been extended to June 23, 2020.⁵
 - By extending the state of emergency, the Government can continue to take the necessary steps to keep BC residents safe.
- Today, the Government of BC announced that a ministerial order has been developed to protect amateur sport organizations, their employees, and volunteers from COVID-19 liabilities.⁶
 - The Government recognized that provincial and local sport organizations have identified challenges with obtaining adequate insurance for COVID-19 related damages and has decided to step in.
 - This new ministerial order will protect:
 - Amateur sport organizations and their representatives from COVID-19 liability.
 - Organizations that follow applicable public- health guidance on how to prevent the spread of the virus.

Terrace

- Today, the City of Terrace announced that City Hall and Public Works and Development Services are open to the public.⁷
 - City Hall has reserved the hours between 8:30 to 9:30 am for seniors, ages 65 and above.
 - Public Safety signage will be displayed at all entrances and must be followed by the public, including:
 - Only enter the facility if you are feeling well
 - Do not enter the facility if you are feeling symptoms, such as fever, chills, new or worsening cough, shortness of breath.

LATEST ADVICE AND MEASURES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

- Today, Canada’s Minister of Small Business, Export Promotion and International Trade announced that the Government of Canada has partnered with the People Outside Safely Together (POST) Promise Program. This is an initiative launched by Canadian private sector organizations to help businesses across the country reopen safely. ⁸
 - The “POST Promise” is a voluntary commitment that business owners and managers can make by following five key public health actions that will help prevent the spread of COVID-19, including:
 1. Maintaining physical distance.
 2. Washing and sanitizing hands.
 3. Cleaning and disinfecting regularly.
 4. Staying home if unwell and self-monitoring for symptoms.
 5. Practicing respiratory etiquette, including wearing a mask
 - Participating businesses that display the “POST Promise” logo can reassure customers that health and safety guidelines are being followed.
