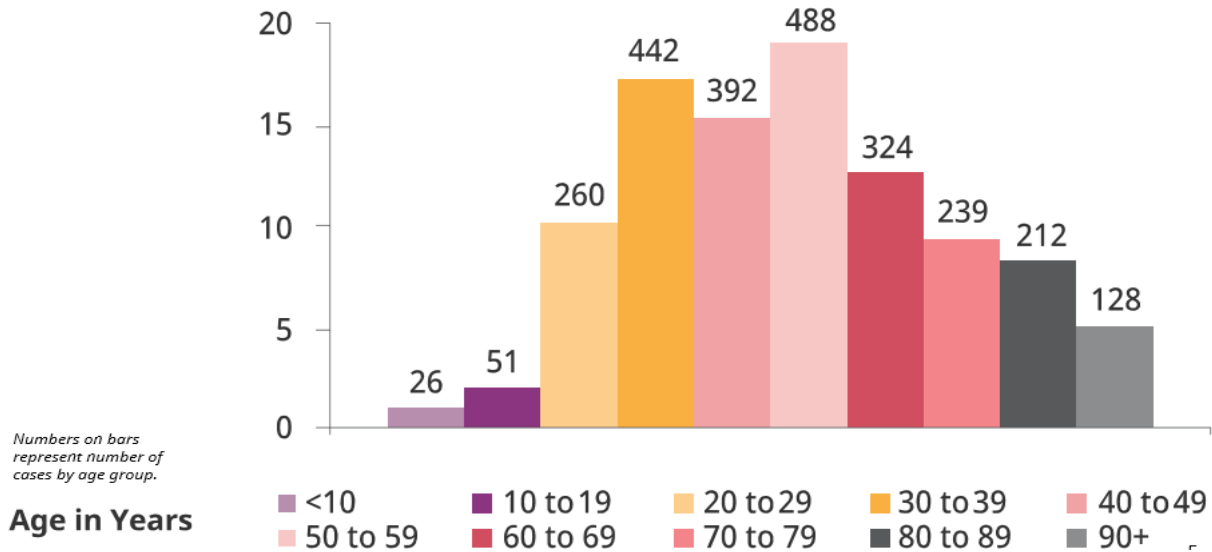

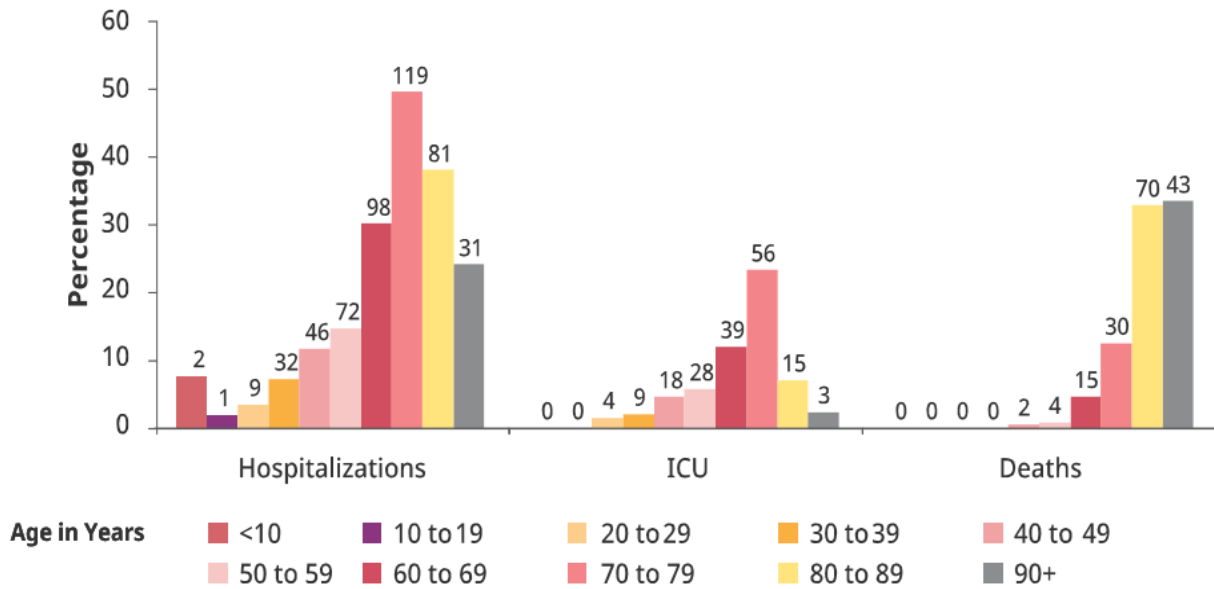
**COVID-19 CASES BY AGE GROUP IN BRITISH COLUMBIA<sup>5</sup>**



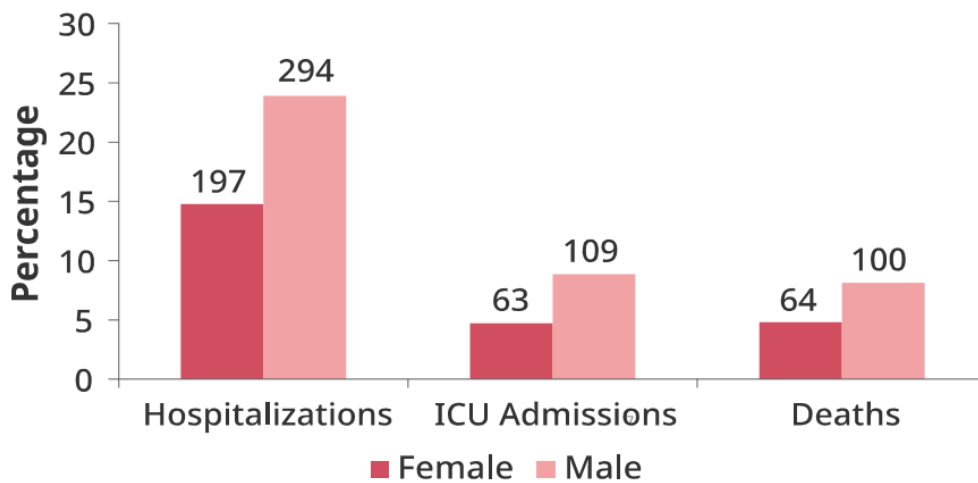

## LATEST ADVICE AND MEASURES IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

- Today, Dr. Bonnie Henry shared information on the spread of COVID-19 and the trends that have been seen throughout BC.<sup>8</sup>
  - For key graphs presented during Dr. Bonnie Henry's update, please see above. It should be noted:
    - All communities in BC have been impacted by COVID-19 but the Lower Mainland has, and continues to be, the most impacted region in BC.
    - The majority of confirmed COVID-19 cases are seen in people between the age range of 30 and 60.
    - The majority of people that seek hospitalization or intensive care are in the 60-80 age range.
    - The majority of people who have died of COVID-19 are in the 80-90 age range.
    - More females than males have been diagnosed with COVID-19, but men are more likely to experience more significant symptoms, leading to hospitalization or death.
- Today, Dr. Bonnie Henry announced that COVID-19 information specific to small communities in BC will be made publicly available in the following weeks.<sup>9</sup>

## LATEST ADVICE AND MEASURES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

- Today, the Prime Minister announced that seniors eligible for the Old Age Security (OAS) pension and the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) will receive their one-time, tax-free payment during the week of July 6, 2020 to cover extra costs during the pandemic.<sup>10</sup>
  - The one-time, tax-free payments include:
    - \$300 for seniors eligible for the OAS pension.
    - \$200 for seniors eligible for the GIS.
  - This measure, in combination with existing benefits, is providing:
    - Nearly \$900 for single seniors.
    - More than \$1,500 for senior couples
  - Senior citizens do not need to apply for this one-time special payment and instead, the payment will be issued automatically during the week of July 6<sup>th</sup>.
