# LATEST ADVICE AND MEASURES IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

- Today, the BC Government announced the appointment of an education steering committee to assist the Province in preparing for the 2021 school year.<sup>5</sup>
  - The education steering committee contains teachers, parents, First Nations, support staff, principals and vice principals, school boards and trustees, and the public health sector.
  - The committee will:
    - Review lessons learned from March to June, including, identifying existing and potential issues and propose solutions.
    - Develop and support parent and teacher resources
- Today, the BC Government announced the extension of the temporary layoff provisions to August 30, 2020, during the COVID-19 pandemic.<sup>6</sup>
  - It is expected that businesses honour their obligation to workers and reach agreements with their employees in the event a further extension is required.
- The BC Government also announced today that the Province is now accepting applications from local governments, community groups, and First Nations for nearly \$160 million in infrastructure grants to help strengthen communities throughout British Columbia.<sup>7</sup>
  - This investment will help strengthen the economy by creating jobs, and increasing revenues, which is especially important in recovery from the impacts of COVID-19.
  - Project criteria support a wide rang of infrastructure needs and priorities, including, broadband connectivity, efficient and reliable energy, Indigenous health and educational facilities, local public transit, and improved resilience to natural disasters.

# LATEST ADVICE AND MEASURES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

- Today, the Prime Minister announced the launch of the Canada Student Service Grant (CSSG) to support post-secondary students and recent graduates if they volunteer to support in the COVID-19 response.<sup>9</sup>
  - The CSSG will provide volunteers with a one-time payment of between \$1,000 and \$5,000 based on the number of hours served.
- Today, in closing of the COVID-19 research funding competition, Canada's Minister of Health announced that an investment of more than \$109 million over one year will be made to support COVID-19 research. <sup>10</sup>
  - This investment will support 139 research teams from across the country that will:
    - Focus on accelerating the development, testing, and implementation of measures to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 and its negative consequences on people, communities, and health systems.
    - Use findings to inform decision-making and planning at national and international levels.
