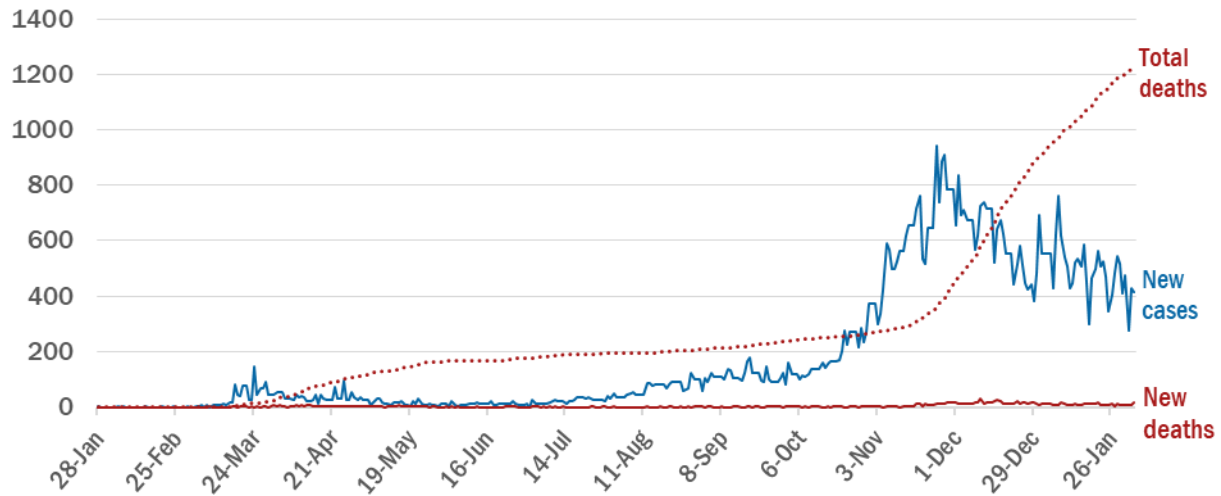

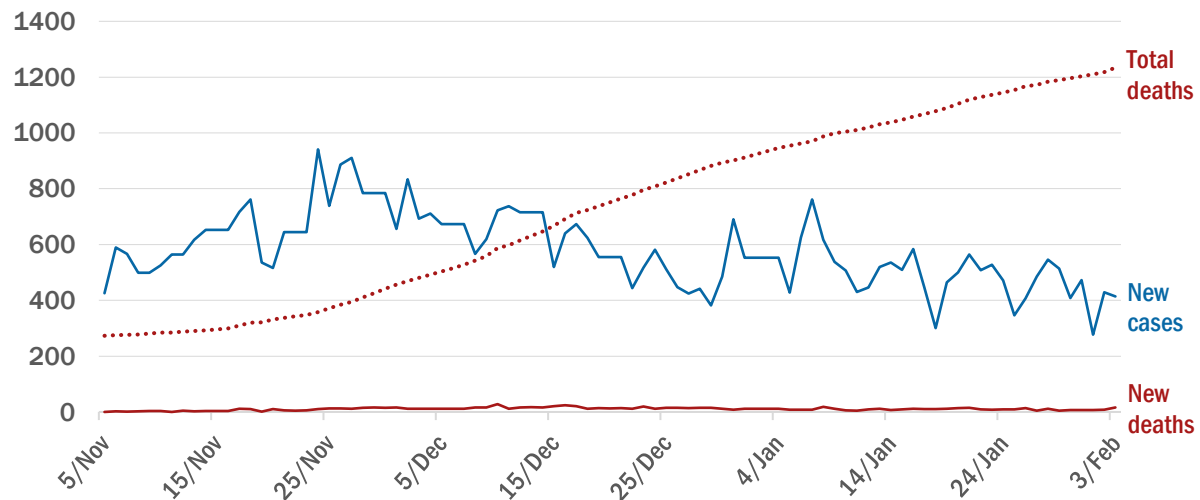

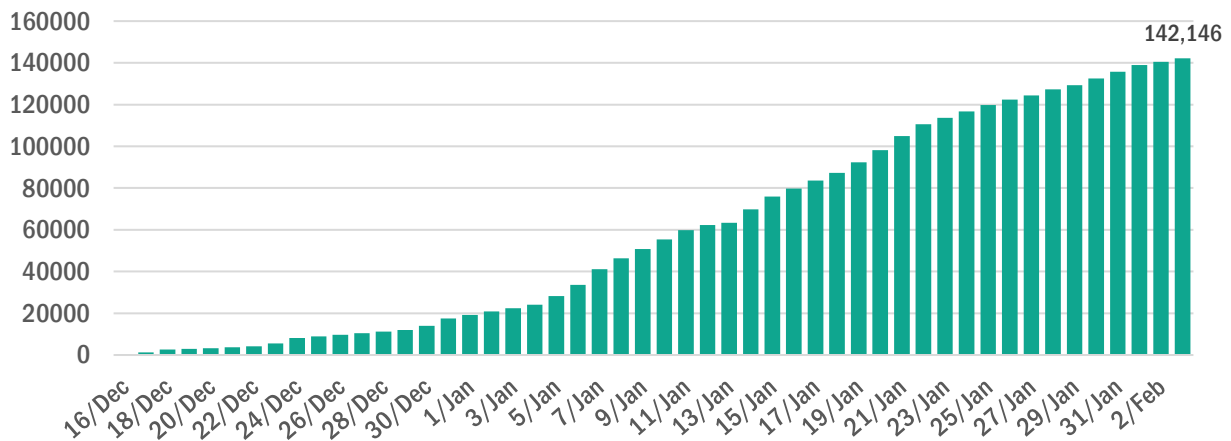

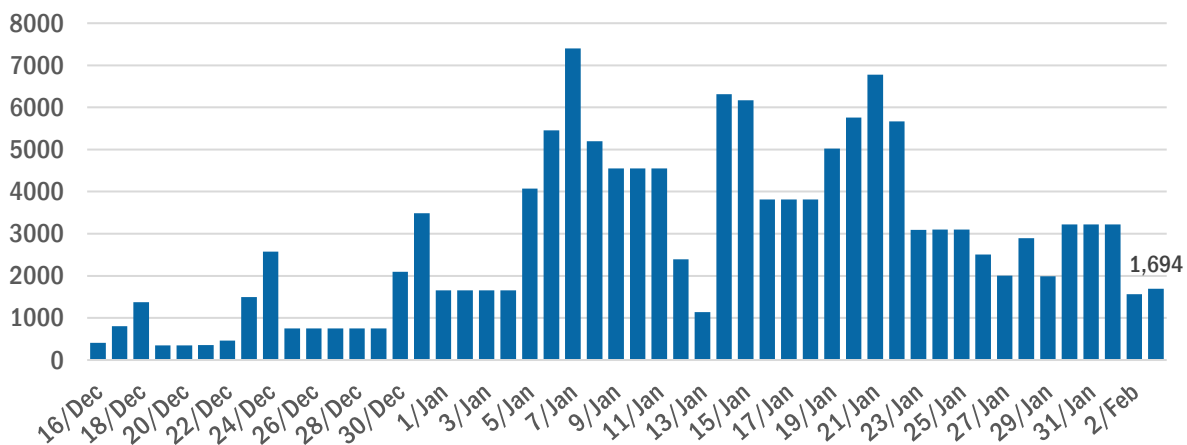

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

- Today, B.C.'s provincial health officer, Dr. Bonnie Henry, and B.C. Minister of Health, Adrian Dix, provided an update on the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic in B.C. Highlights include the following:⁸
 - B.C.'s COVID-19 pandemic response is a careful balance between protecting the communities and keeping open as much as possible safely.
 - Until the COVID-19 vaccines are widely available, everyone will have to continue to follow public health orders and use the layers of protection, whether at work, school, home or at a restaurant.
 - "We know the COVID-19 variants make things more challenging as the virus is more likely to spread quickly, which is why we all need to continue to make safe choices. Let's choose less and choose small. This is the path to get to the brighter days ahead."

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

- Today, Dr. Theresa Tam, Chief Public Health Officer, released a statement on the ongoing COVID-19 situation in Canada, which included the following:⁹
 - "There has been a gradual, recent decrease in COVID-19 activity. However, outbreaks continue to occur in high-risk populations and communities, including hospitals and long-term care homes, correctional facilities, congregate living settings, Indigenous communities, and more remote areas of the country."
 - "These factors underscore the importance of sustaining public health measures and individual practices and not easing restrictions too fast or too soon."
 - "This is particularly important in light of the emergence of new virus variants of concern that could rapidly accelerate transmission of COVID-19 in Canada."
- Today, Carla Qualtrough, Canada's Minister of Employment, Workforce Development and Disability Inclusion, announced funding of \$6.7 million for Phase II of the Canada Learning Bond Pilot Project:¹⁰
 - The purpose of this is to support Canadians in saving for post-secondary education despite the economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.
 - The Canada Learning Bond will:
 - Assist children from low-income families and children in care born in 2004 and later.
 - Provide an initial payment of \$500 plus \$100 for each year of eligibility, up to age 15, or a maximum of \$2,000. Personal contributions not required.
 - The bond is retroactive and can be requested on behalf of an eligible child.
