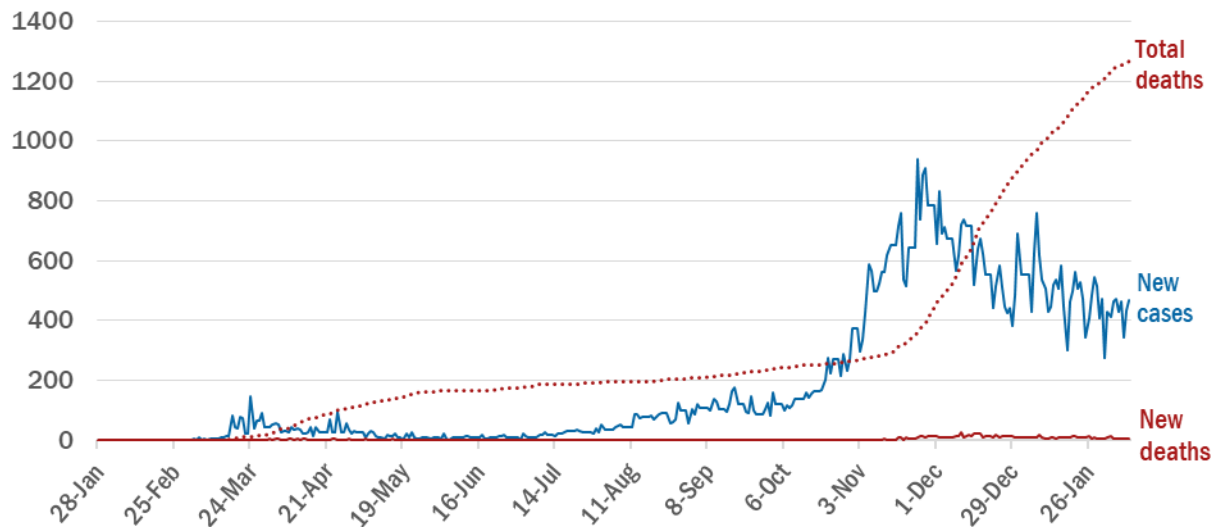

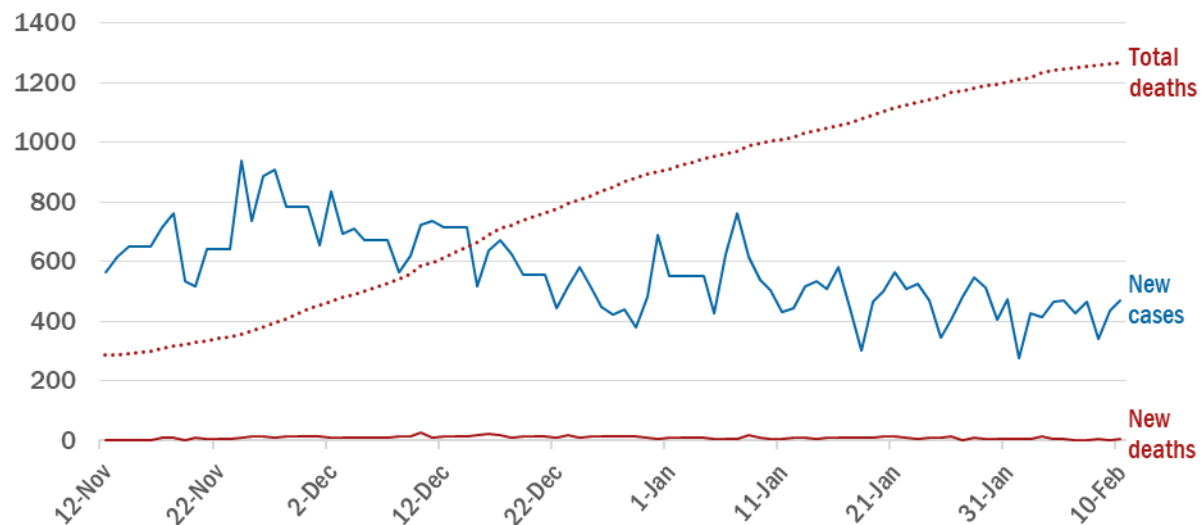

COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN BC – PAST THREE MONTHS



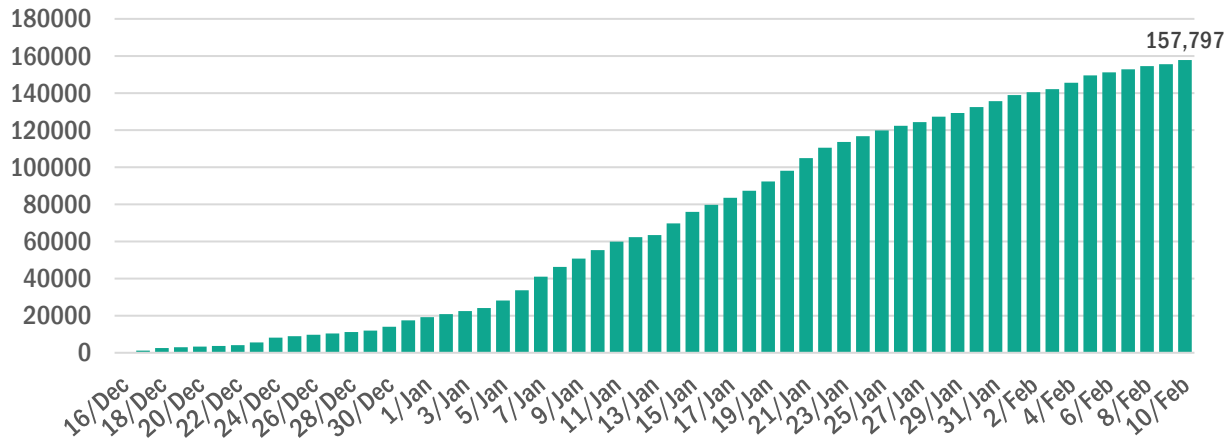

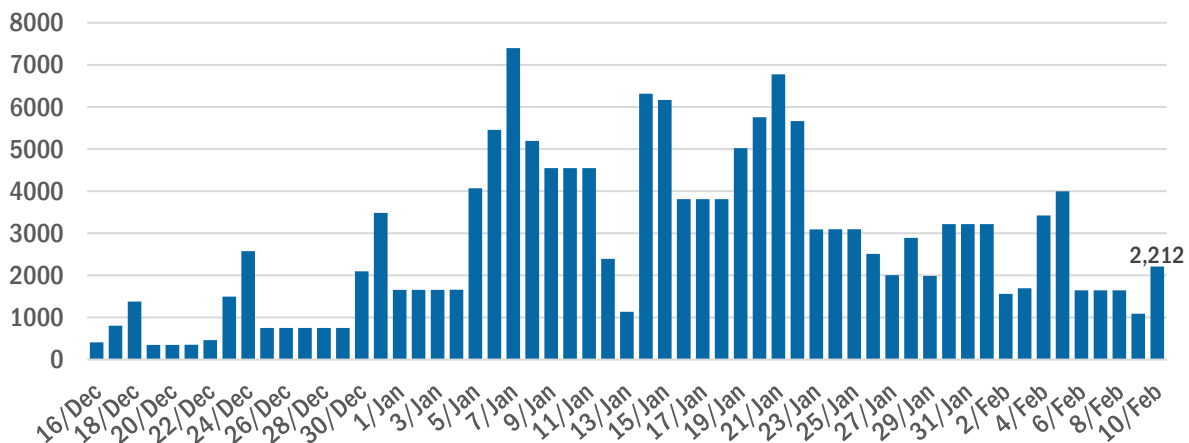

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

- Today, B.C.'s provincial health officer, Dr. Bonnie Henry, and B.C. Minister of Health, Adrian Dix, provided an update on the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic in B.C. Highlights include the following:⁸
 - “The risks from COVID-19 remain high for all of us, especially with the variants of concern, which is why staying in our local community and avoiding any unnecessary travel is so important right now.”
 - “This weekend is the weekend to stay home – to show your family and friends you care by not giving COVID-19 the opportunity to spread.”
 - “By choosing small and safe for you and everyone around you, we can slow the virus and keep our positive momentum going.”

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN THE YUKON TERRITORY

- No significant updates from the Yukon Government.

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

- Today, Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) provided the following COVID-19 update for Indigenous Peoples and communities:⁹
 - “Although cases are decreasing and vaccines are arriving, Canadians must not let their guard down, and must continue to follow public health measures to protect themselves, their friends, and neighbours.”
 - “It is essential that everyone continue with physical distancing, wearing masks, avoiding gatherings and non-essential travel, staying home when sick, and keeping up with frequent hand, cough, and surface hygiene. The combination of all these public health measures is required to stop the spread of the virus.”
 - As of February 4, 2021, nearly 1.2 million Moderna and Pfizer vaccines have been distributed across the country. As of February 9, 2021, ISC was aware of 344 Indigenous communities with vaccinations underway in the provinces and territories.
 - Vaccination efforts continue to be a priority, including “working to identify barriers, challenges, and opportunities for increasing vaccine uptake for Indigenous Peoples, and making the vaccine more available in locations that are welcoming and accessible to Indigenous Peoples.”
