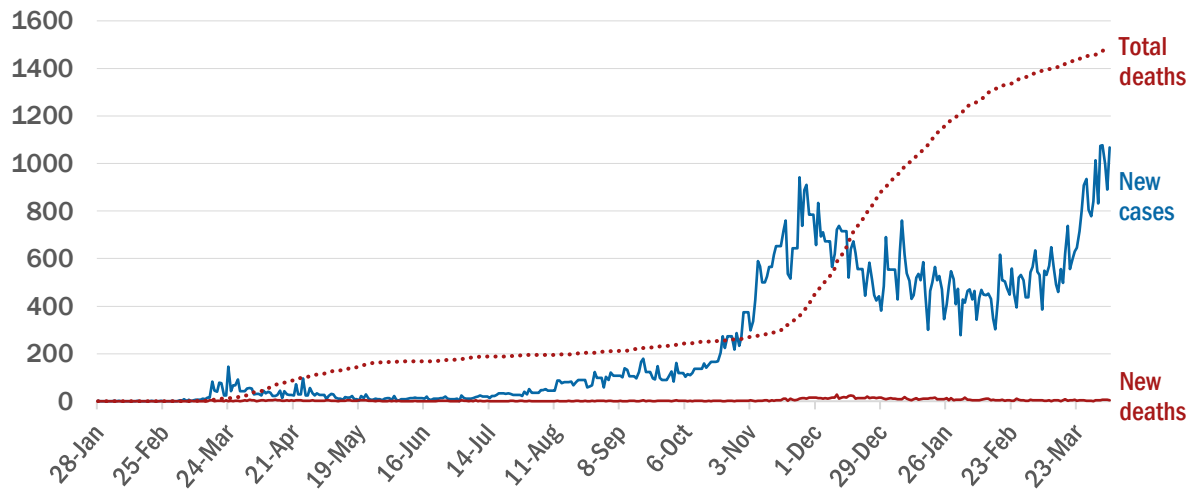

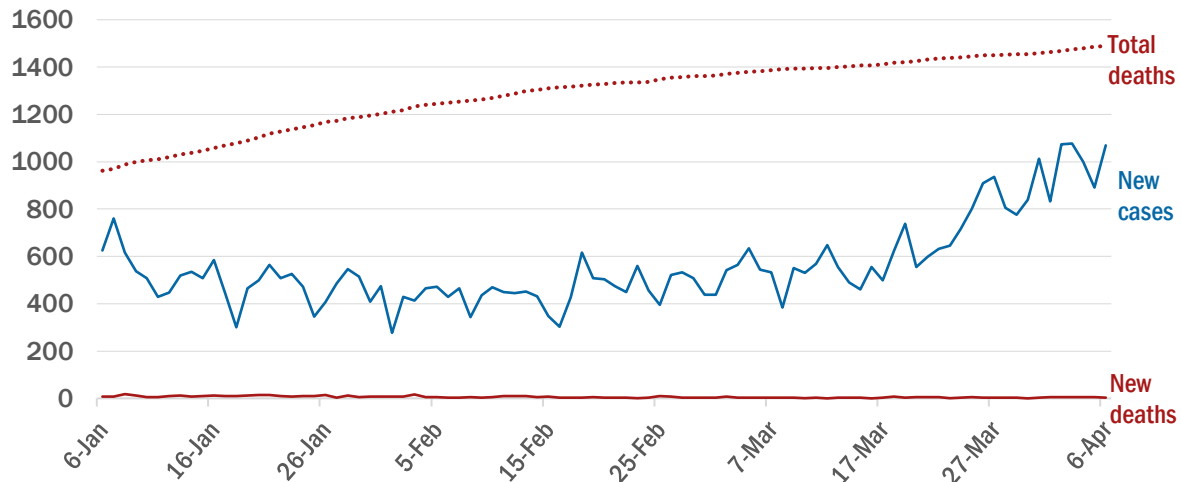

COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN BC – PAST THREE MONTHS



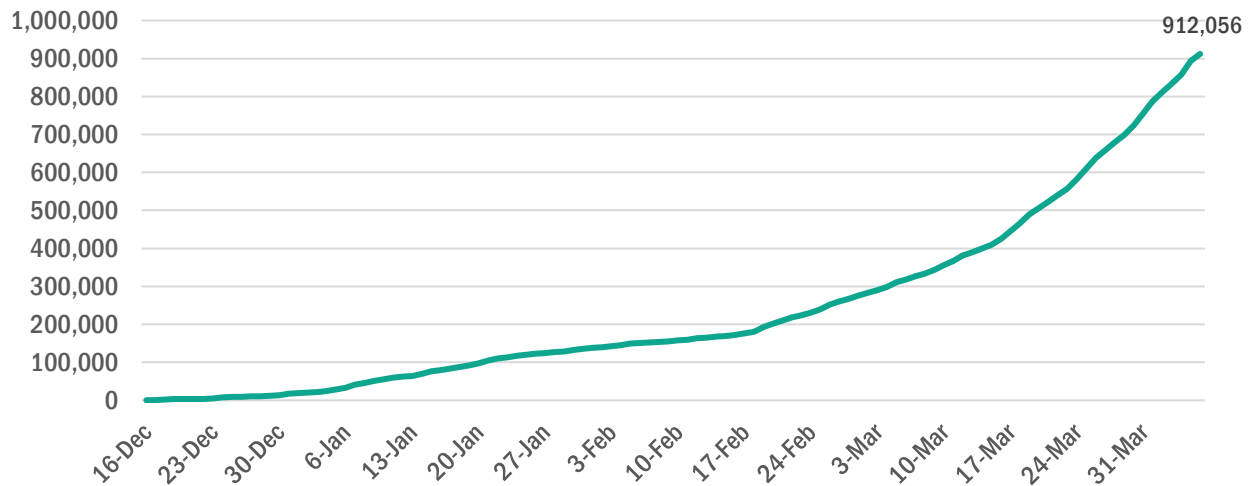

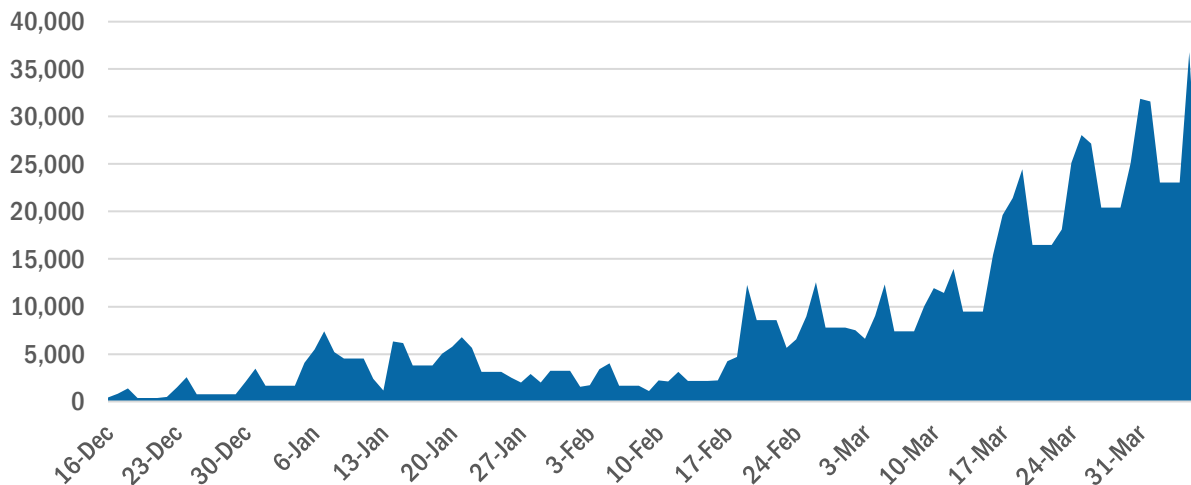

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

- Today, Dr. Bonnie Henry, B.C.'s Provincial Health Officer, and Adrian Dix, Minister of Health, provided a joint update on the COVID-19 response in the province:⁶
 - There are 207 new confirmed cases of variants of concern, for a total of 3,766.
 - B.1.1.7 (U.K) – 2,838
 - B.1.351 (South African) – 51
 - P.1 (Brazil) – 877
 - 266 cases are active.
 - “As expected, an increasing number of new cases of COVID-19 are variants of concern, and this is anticipated to continue as these variants take over from earlier virus strains. Unnecessary travel and social gatherings are fuelling the fire for variant of concern transmission – and we all have the ability to slow that down.”
 - Today, the province officially launched the ‘Get Vaccinated’ online vaccine registration and booking system, allowing everyone to register and book their vaccine appointment online, when eligible. Currently, the following groups are eligible for the next phase of the vaccination program:
 - Indigenous peoples age 18 and older
 - Age 71 years and older
 - ‘Clinically extremely vulnerable’ individuals with authorization letters

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN THE YUKON TERRITORY

- There are no significant updates in the Yukon Territory today.

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

- Today, Chief Public Health Officer, Dr. Theresa Tam, released a statement regarding the ongoing response to COVID-19 in Canada, which included the following:⁷
 - Variants of concern are contributing to the current resurgence of cases within the country. To date, totals include:
 - B.1.1.7 (UK) – 14,010
 - P.1 (Brazil) – 857
 - B.1.351 (South African) – 337
 - The B.1.1.7 (UK) variant is known to cause more severe illness and increased risk of death. To date, it has accounted for over 90% of all variant cases reported across Canada.
 - A significant number of P.1 (Brazil) variant cases have also been reported in B.C. and Ontario, with an increase from 460 to 857 cases within the last week.
 - Early evidence suggests the P.1 variant may reduce the effectiveness of vaccines, increasing the importance to control its spread.
 - This week, Canada surpassed over one million COVID-19 cases since the beginning of the pandemic, including over 23,000 deaths.
