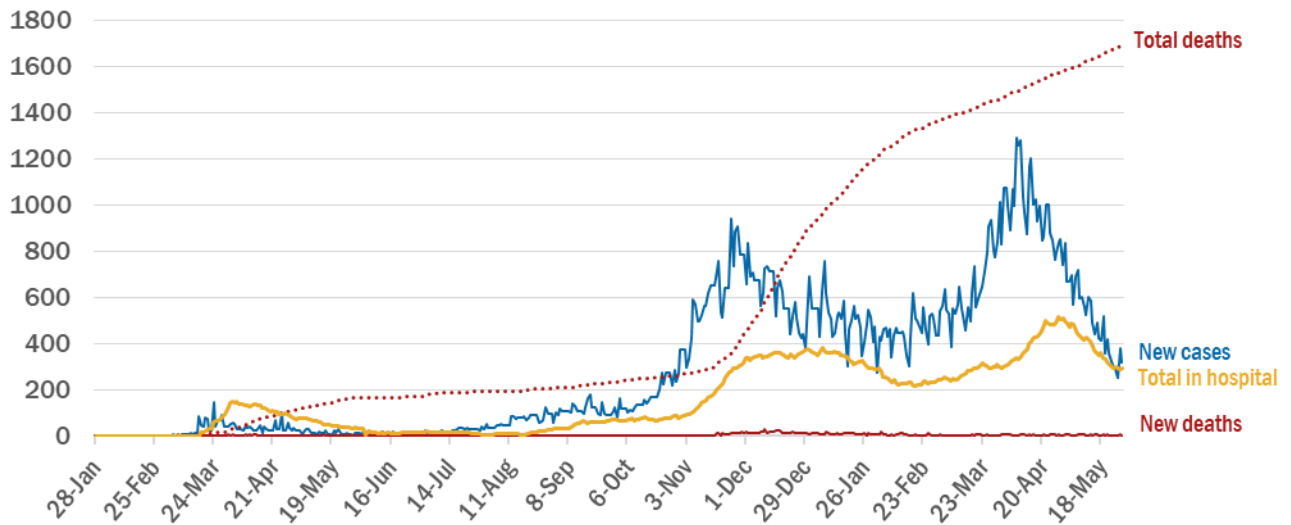

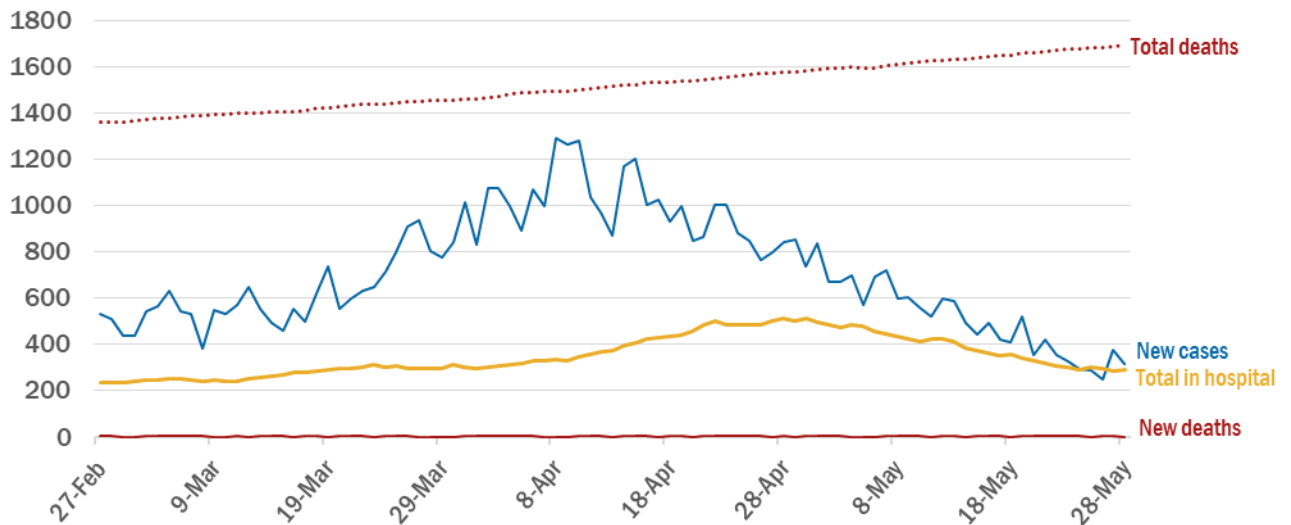

COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN BC – PAST THREE MONTHS



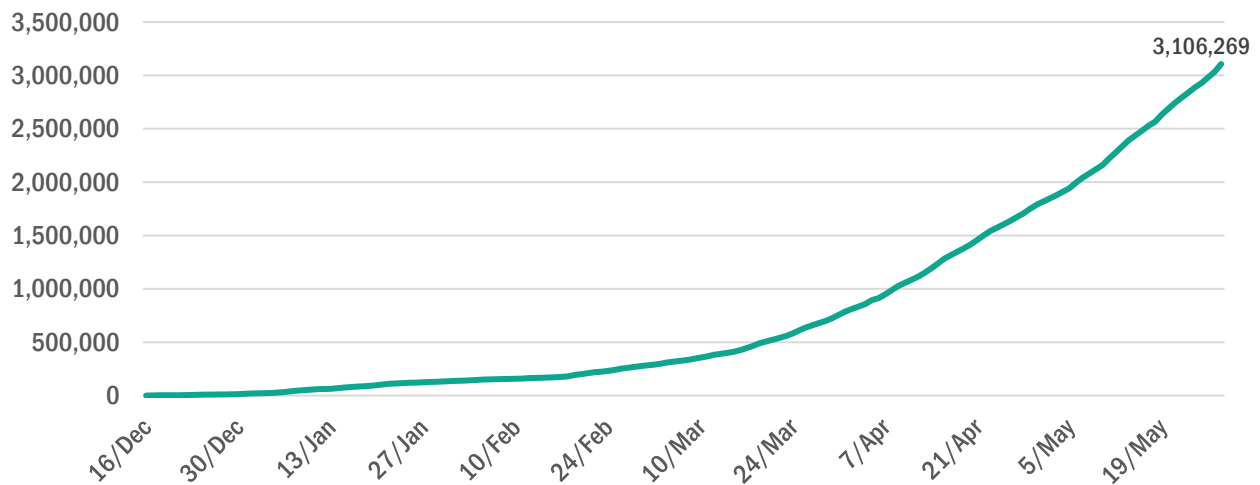

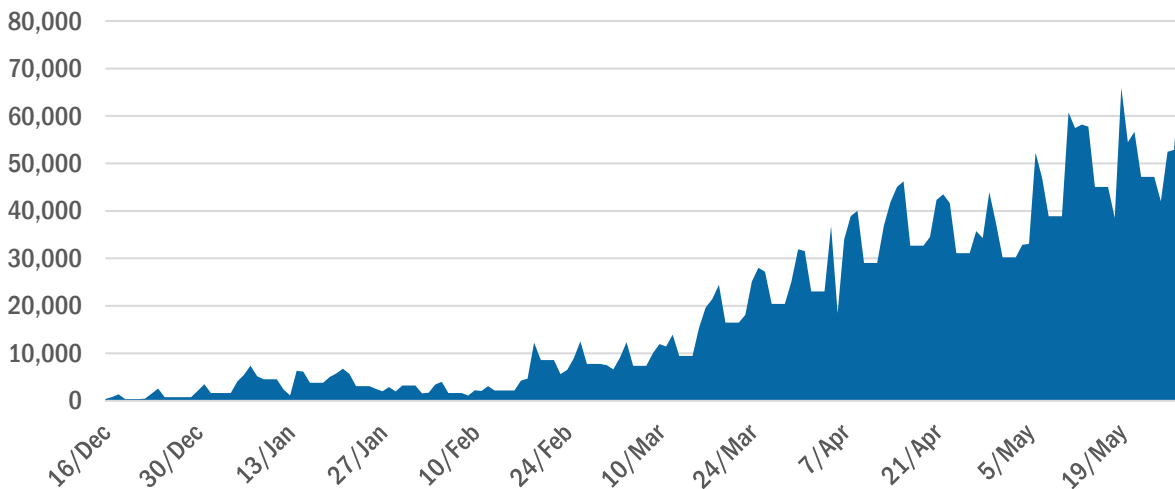

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

- Today, Dr. Bonnie Henry, B.C.'s provincial health officer, and Adrian Dix, Minister of Health, provided a joint statement regarding COVID-19 in BC. Highlights include the following:⁶
 - “This has been a milestone week in B.C.’s COVID-19 pandemic response. Our restart plan began, our surgical renewal strategy resumed, and we have started the accelerated delivery of second doses to people throughout the province.”
 - “We have a roadmap and now we must stick to the path: doing what we can to further slow the spread of COVID-19 and break the chains of transmission in our communities.”
 - “The virus is still spreading with new cases and clusters, which is why using our layers of protection and getting vaccinated – especially in this time of transition – is so important.”
 - “We are moving to a different and better place for all of us, so let’s continue to do our part to get there as soon as we can. Together, we will restart B.C. and put the COVID-19 pandemic behind us.”
- Today, the Northern Health Authority provided a statement from Quesnel’s first 12-year-old resident to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, Ehlana Williams, regarding her choice and why she encourages others to do the same.⁷
 - As the COVID-19 vaccine roll-out continues through Northern Health, we are seeing community members of all ages attend the clinics to receive a dose of the vaccine that can protect those they love and the general public.
 - We watch as our children discover a strength and resiliency that they never needed before but we also watch as they step up and realize a sense of community to do what they can for their neighbours, family, friends and often strangers.
 - What made you want to come down and get vaccinated today?
 - “My step-mom told us this morning that we were allowed to come down without an appointment, so my brother and I came down today. My parents told me that once we all get it, I can see my family sooner and do the things that COVID is restricting.”
 - What would you like to say to others, especially kids, about the vaccine?
 - “It didn’t even hurt! It feels like a tiny mosquito bite. And it’s better for us in the long run to get it – if you think about it too long, it can stress you out, just come get it.”
