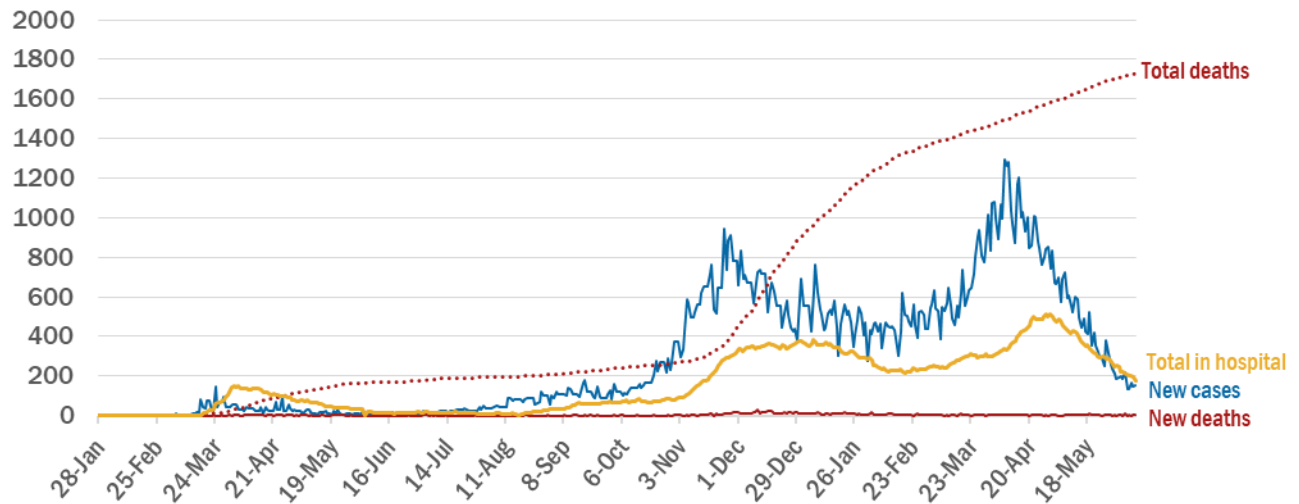

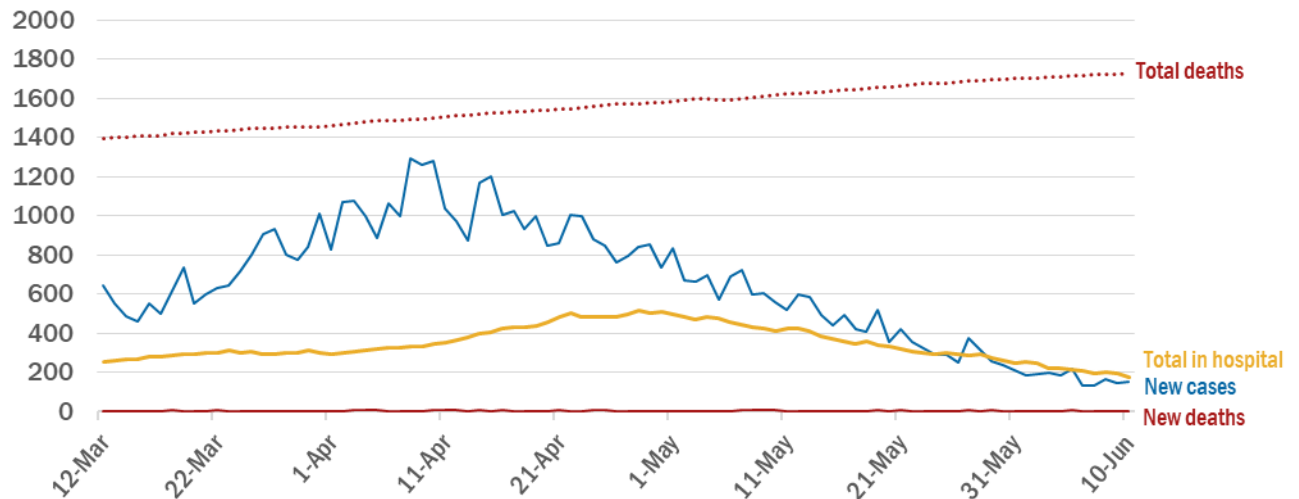

**COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN BC – PAST THREE MONTHS**



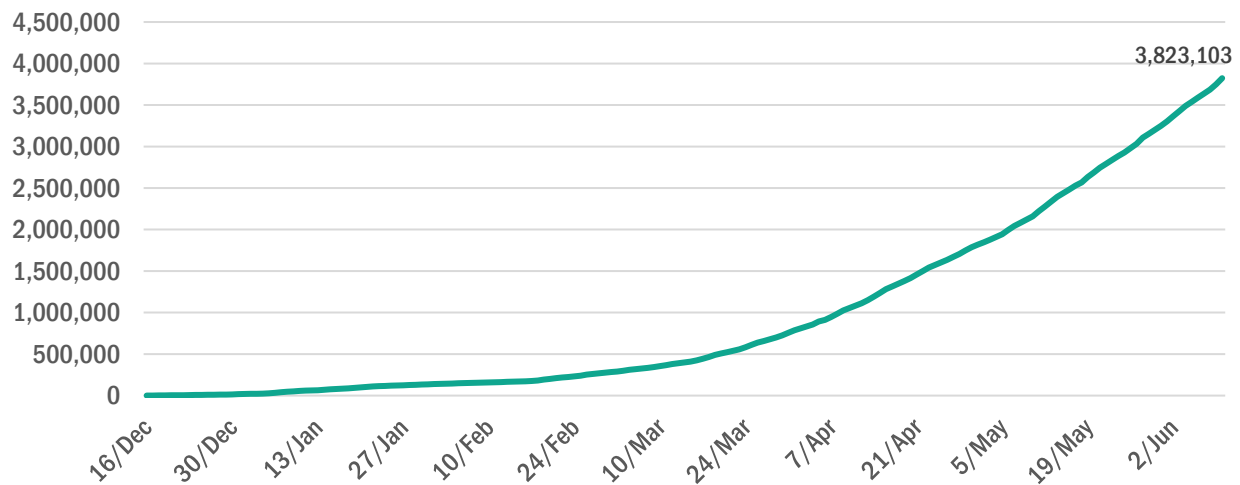

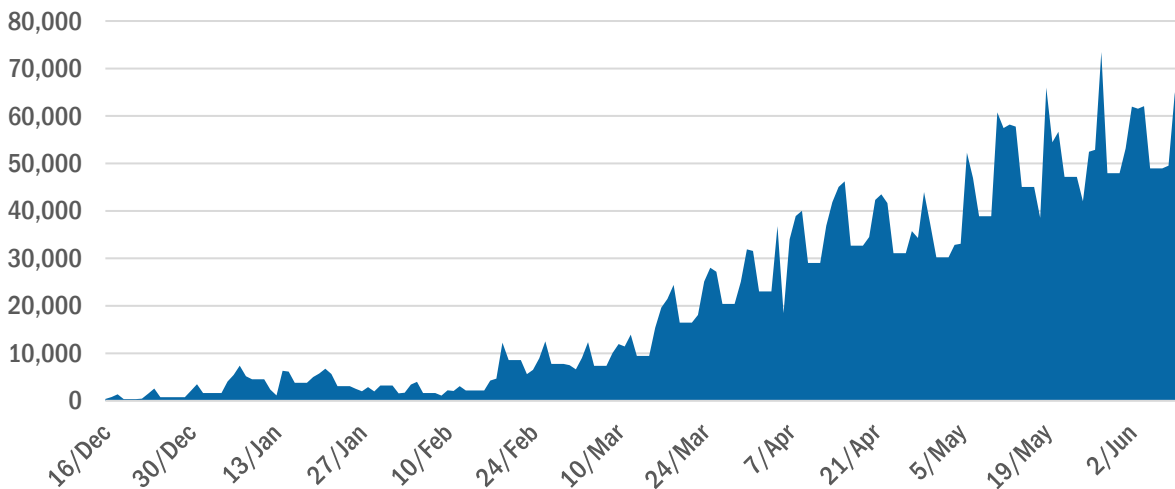

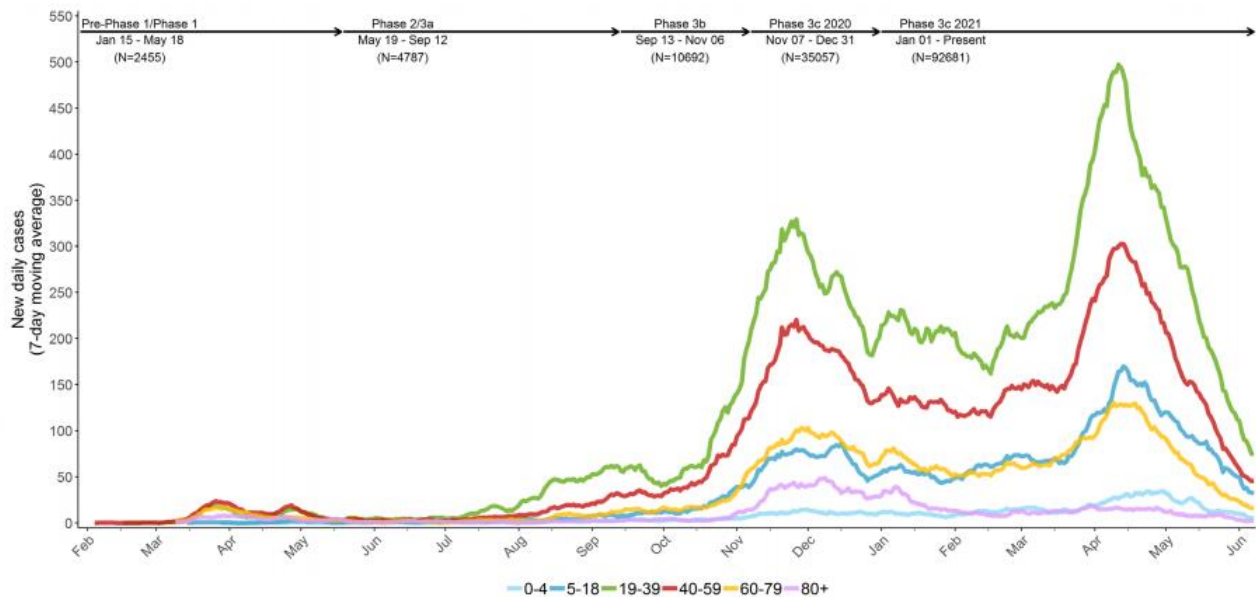

## SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

- Today, Dr. Bonnie Henry, B.C.'s provincial health officer, shared the latest epidemiological modelling for COVID-19 in British Columbia and held a live press conference providing an update on the provincial situation.<sup>6</sup>
- **Findings from the modelling include the following:**

**Figure 1: Modelling: Daily Case Count by Age Group from January 2020 to June 7, 2021**

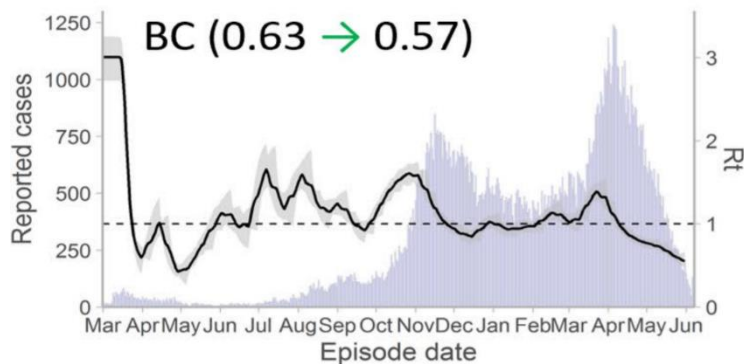
The daily case count of COVID-19 for every age group is showing a downward trend, following the spike in April.



**Figure 2: Modelling: Recent Trends – Estimate of  $R_t$**

The  $R_t$  value for the Province, i.e. the average number of people each person with COVID-19 goes on to infect, remains below 1 and is trending downward in all regions in B.C.

$R_t$  is a measure of how fast the disease is spreading. An  $R$  above one means an outbreak is growing. When  $R_t$  is under 1 disease spread slows and there is potential for the outbreak to be controlled.

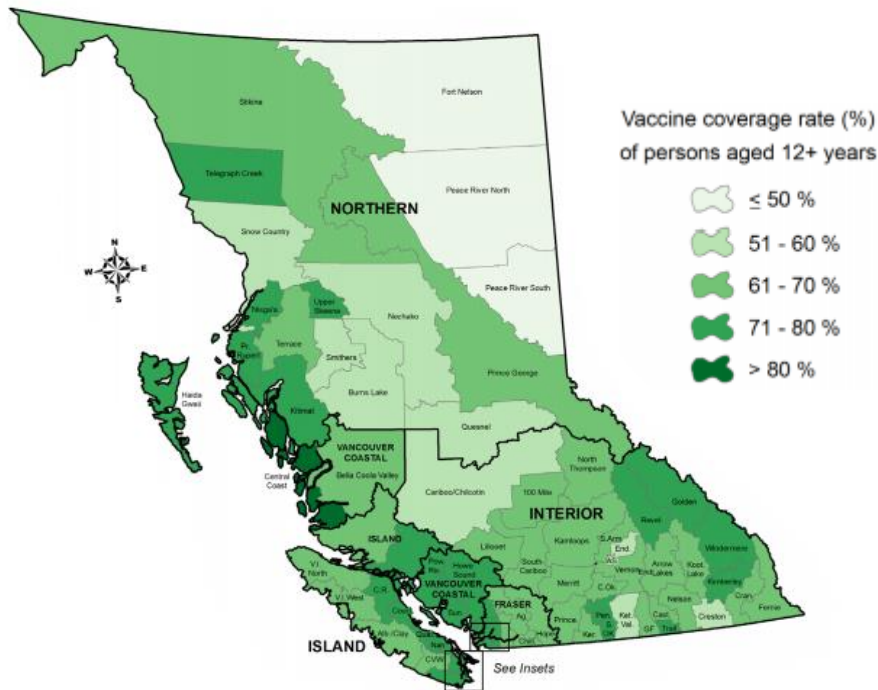


**Solid black line:** median  $R_t$  modeled using all reported cases up to June 7, 2021; **Grey band:** 5%-95% credible interval; **Purple bars:** all reported cases. Due to lag from symptom onset to reporting, most recent case counts and  $R_t$  are not shown.

**Figure 3: Geographic Distribution of COVID-19 Vaccination Coverage by Local Health Authority**

In most areas of the province, over 50% of people aged 12 years of age and older in every Local Health Region have received a first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.



● **Highlights from the live press conference include the following<sup>7</sup>:**

- “As a reminder, invitations to book an appointment for the second dose of COVID-19 vaccine will be sent after 8 weeks from the first dose and may be delayed by 1 or 2 weeks.”
- “As today’s modelling presentation shows us, British Columbia is in a good position to continue to safely move forward with BC’s Restart plan. Community transmission, hospitalizations and deaths are all declining as immunizations are going up.”
- “The key to our success is all of you – first to lessen the spread and now to get immunized. We are grateful for how you have done and continue to do your part”.

## SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN THE YUKON TERRITORY

- Today, Dr. Brendan Hanley, Yukon’s Chief Medical Officer of Health, announced three\* new confirmed cases of COVID-19 and one probable case.<sup>8</sup>
  - Two of these cases are close contacts of a previous case.
  - There are now 13 active cases of COVID-19 in Yukon; 5 of these are the P.1 (Gamma) variant of concern.
    - 12 of these cases were not fully vaccinated.
    - 1 person was fully vaccinated and is recovering with mild symptoms.
  - All are isolating and recovering at home.
  - Case investigations for all are ongoing.

## SIGNIFICANT UPDATES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

- Today, Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) released a COVID-19 update for Indigenous Peoples and communities.<sup>9</sup> Highlights include the following:
  - “Based on Statistics Canada’s 2020 population projections, as of June 8, 2021, over 80% of individuals aged 18 and older in First Nations, Inuit and territorial communities have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine.”
  - “Over 72% of individuals aged 12 and older in First Nations, Inuit and territorial communities have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine. Of this group, 41% have received their second dose.”
  - “Different approaches are being implemented across Canada, including home-based, school-based, family-based and drive-thru clinics to reach households and support uptake. Many provinces and territories are prioritizing first doses to the population aged 12 and older.”
  - “Canada recognizes that First Nations and Inuit are among the most at risk during the pandemic, in particular, those in remote and fly-in communities are uniquely at risk. Additional support is currently available through the Indigenous Community Support Fund.”
  - “This fund helps Indigenous communities and organizations prevent, prepare for and respond to COVID-19, and address specific needs identified by communities and their members.”
  - “First Nations, Inuit and Métis also have access to all other measures provided through the Government of Canada’s COVID-19 Economic Response Plan. This includes measures such as the recent proposed extension of the Canada Recovery Benefit and of the Canada Recovery Caregiving Benefit.”
