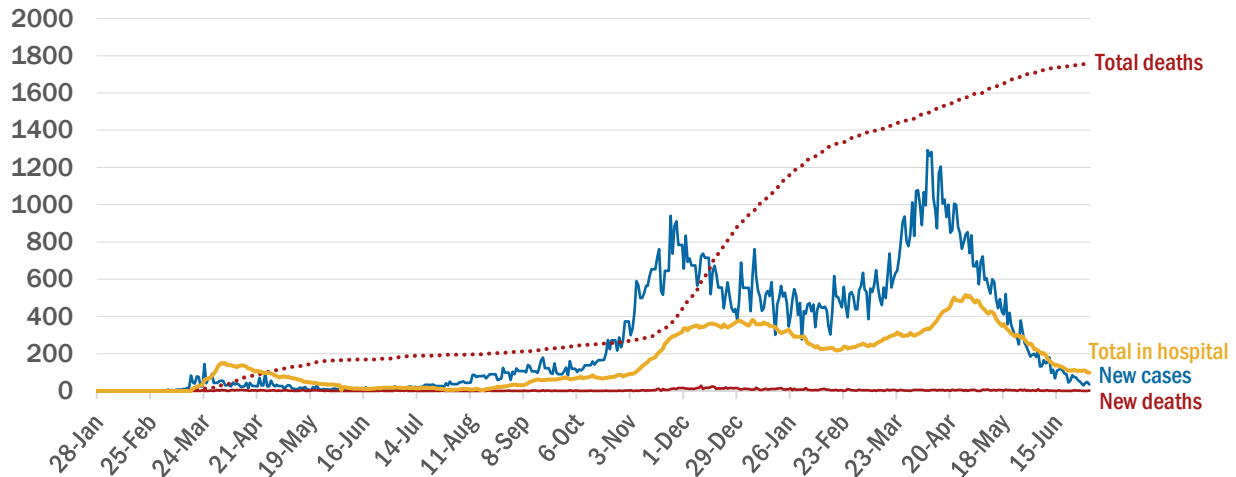

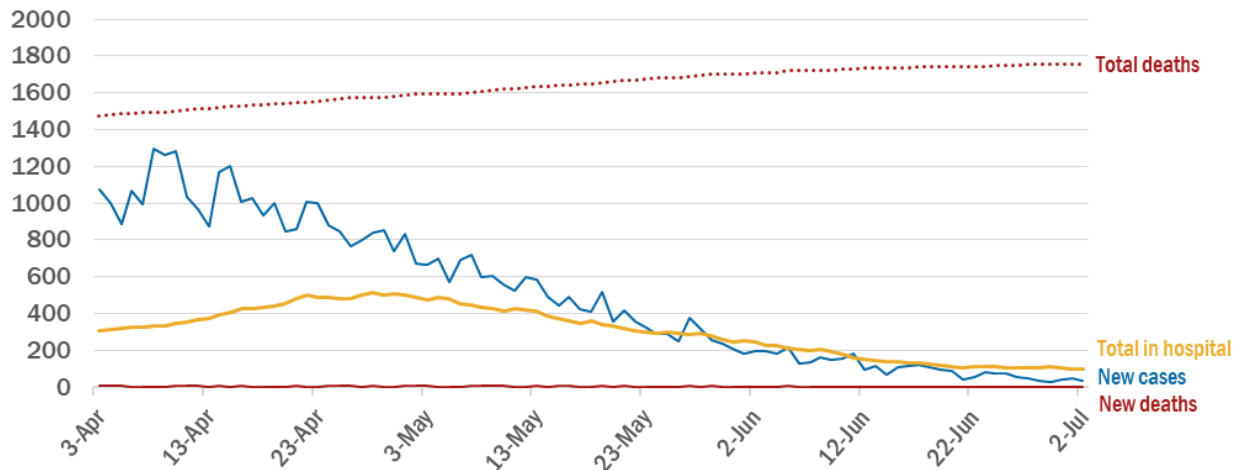

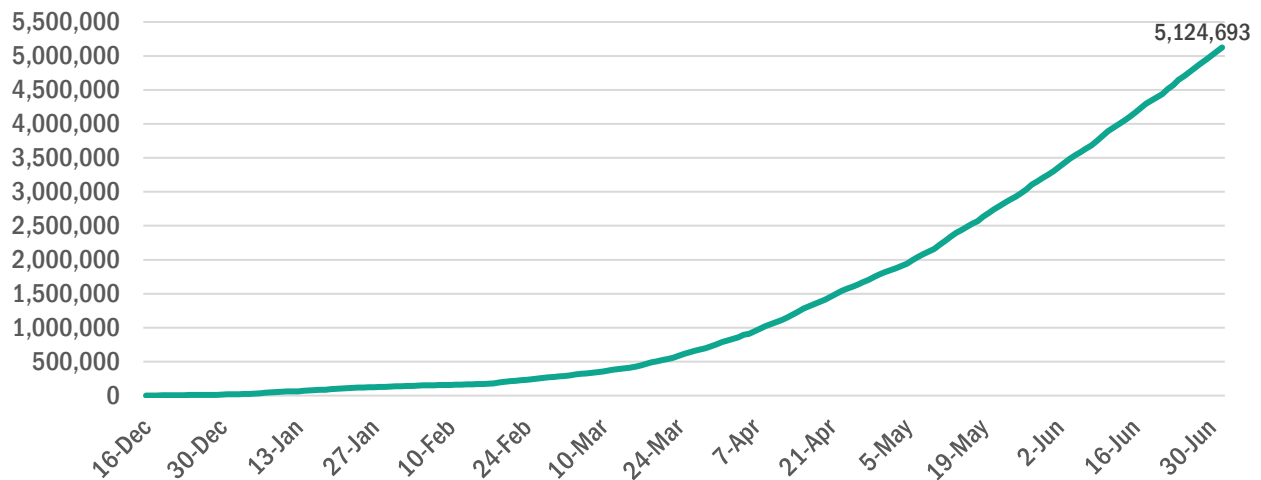

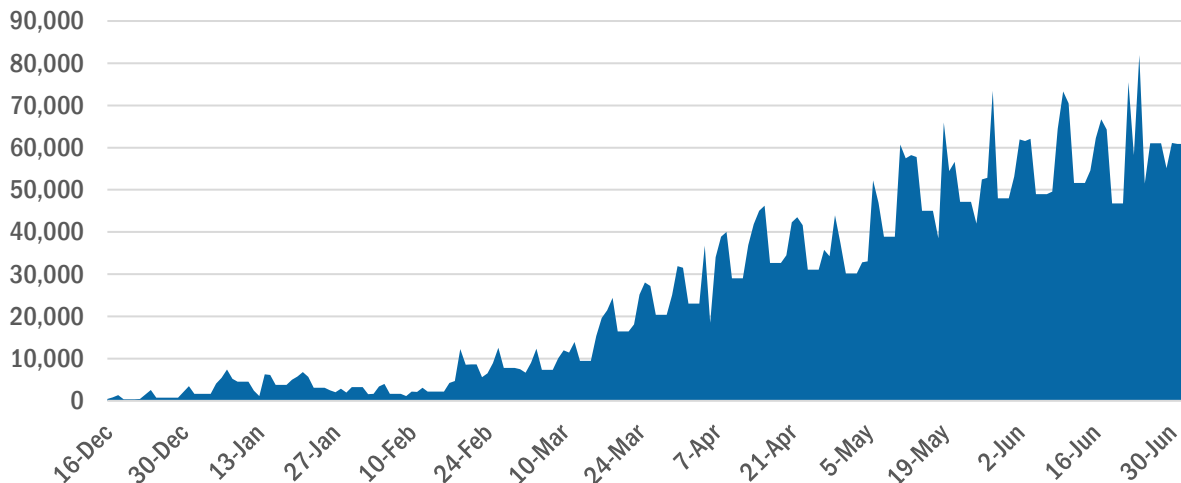

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

- Today, Dr. Theresa Tam, Chief Public Health Officer, issued a statement regarding the updated advice from the National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) on the use of mRNA COVID-19 vaccines.⁶ Highlights include the following:
 - In light of very rare reports of myocarditis (inflammation of the heart) and pericarditis (inflammation of the tissue surrounding the heart) following vaccination with mRNA vaccines, NACI is providing updated guidance⁷ on the use of mRNA COVID-19 vaccines.
 - NACI continues to strongly recommend that a complete series with an mRNA vaccine should be offered to all eligible individuals without contraindications, including those 12 years of age and older.
 - The Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine is approved for use in people 12 years or older and the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine is approved for use in people 18 years of age or older.
 - NACI is also recommending that individuals who are offered an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine should be informed of the very rare risk of myocarditis and/or pericarditis following immunization.
 - As a precaution, NACI recommends that individuals who experienced myocarditis and/or pericarditis after a first dose of an mRNA vaccine should wait to get their second dose until more information is available.
 - A small number of cases of myocarditis and/or pericarditis following immunization with mRNA COVID-19 vaccines have been reported in Canada and internationally. Internationally, cases have been reported more frequently in adolescents and younger adults under 30 years of age, more often in males than in females, and more frequently after a second dose. The majority of cases have been mild and individuals have recovered quickly.
- Today, the Government of Canada issued a reminder that as of July 5th, fully vaccinated travellers eligible to enter Canada can benefit from reduced public health measures.⁸ Highlights include the following:
 - Beginning July 5, 2021 at 12:01 a.m. EDT, fully vaccinated travellers, arriving by land or air, who are eligible to enter Canada and who comply with specific criteria will not be required to quarantine or complete a day-8 test.
 - In addition, fully vaccinated travellers arriving by air will not be required to stay at a government-authorized accommodation (GAA) to await their on-arrival test result.

- There are no changes for travellers who are not fully vaccinated. They are still subject to the mandatory 3-day stay at a GAA (air mode), a 14-day quarantine, all testing requirements (pre-arrival, on arrival/day-1 and day-8) and the mandatory submission of information via ArriveCAN before arriving in Canada.
- All current travel restrictions to Canada remain in place and all other public health requirements continue to apply. Tourism to Canada continues to be prohibited.
