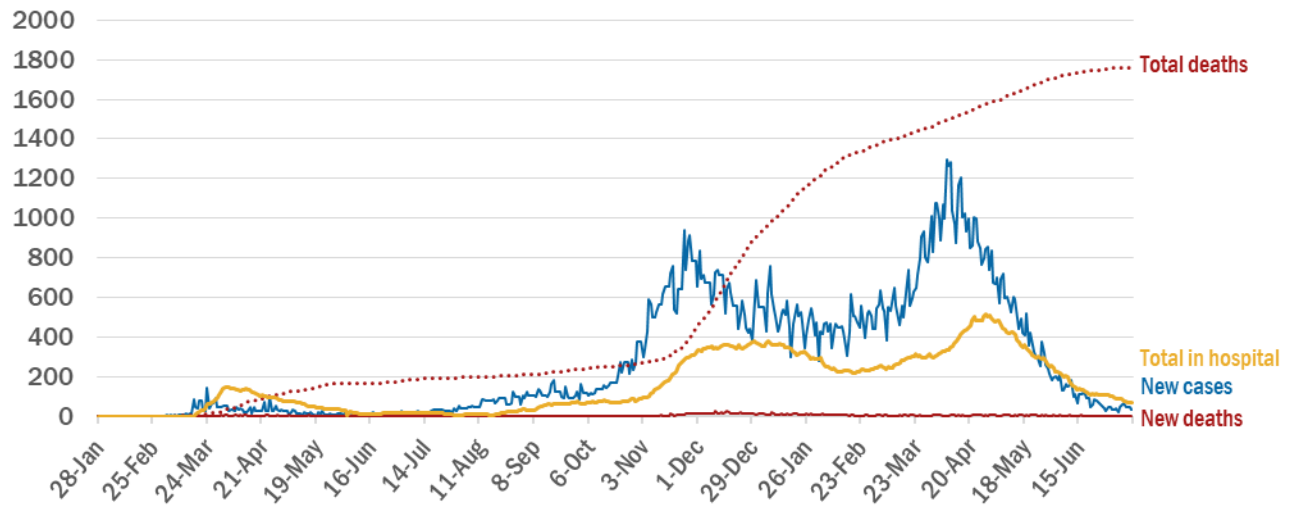

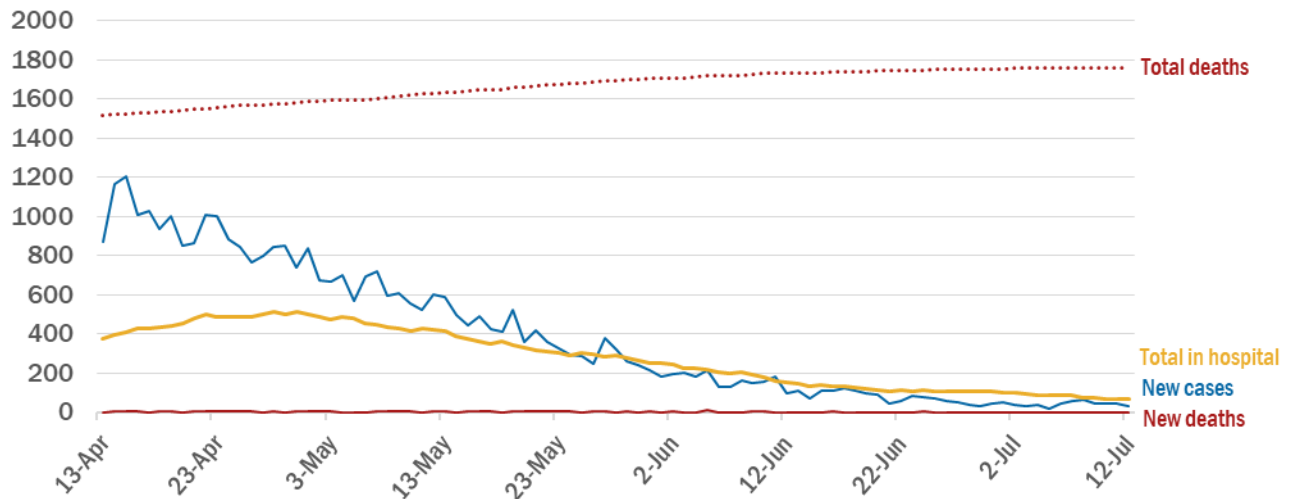

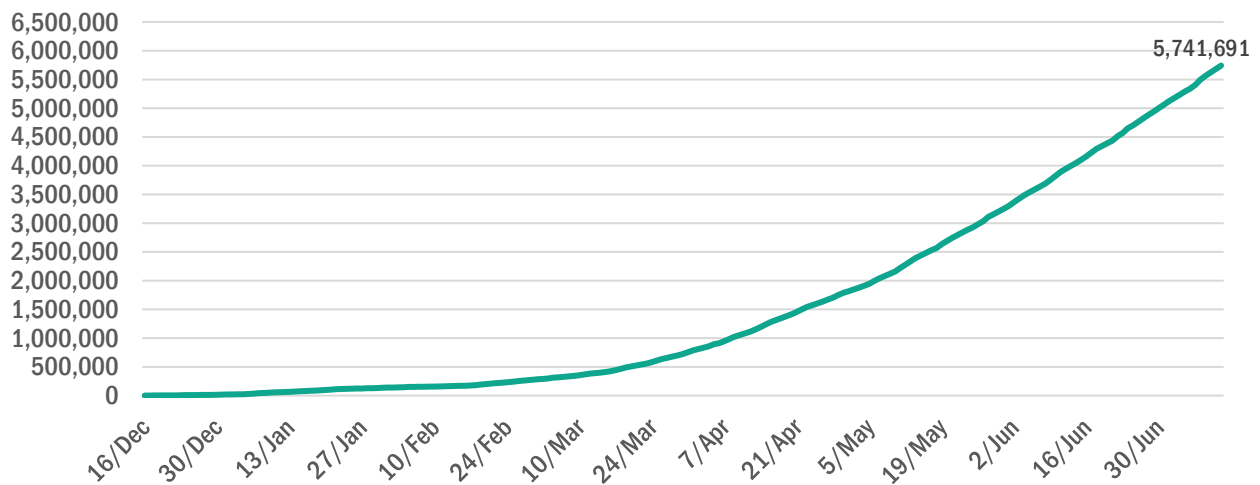

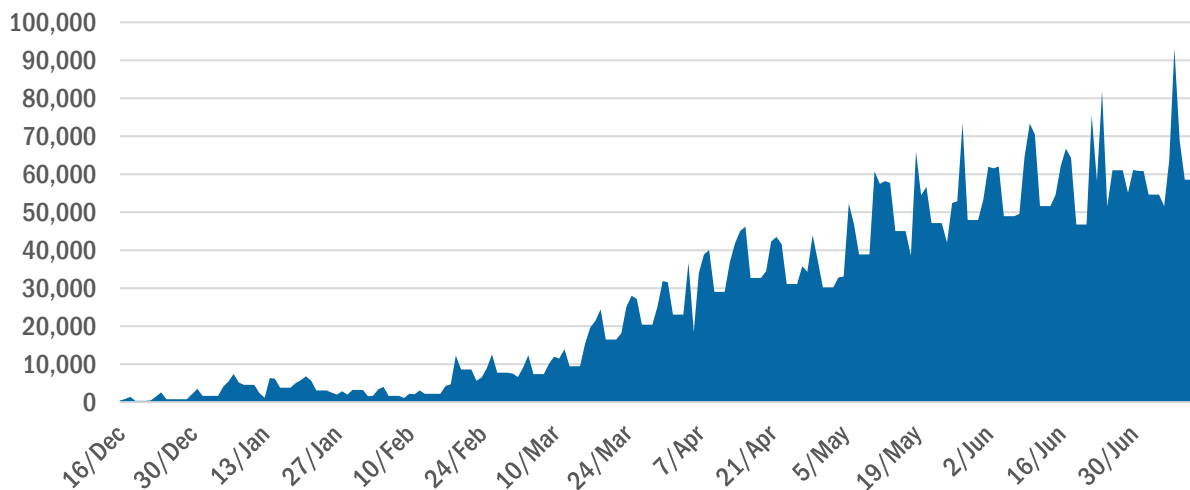

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

- Today the Public Health Agency of Canada provided a statement which included the following:⁶
 - Serosurveillance, is a method of testing a sample of the population to estimate how many people have antibodies of the virus in their blood. The presence of these antibodies indicates that the person has been exposed to the virus, or developed antibodies in response to vaccination.
 - The Public Health Agency of Canada, through the COVID-19 Immunity Task Force, has supported serosurveillance in several communities and settings. From November 2020 to April 2021, Statistics Canada conducted a large representative study, the Canadian COVID-19 Antibody and Health Survey (CCAHS).
 - Data from this study shows that COVID-19 transmission was happening in Canada among people who didn't know they were infected and could have spread it to others.
 - This study also shows that safe and effective vaccines remain our best public health intervention to achieve widespread and lasting protection.
- Today, Mélanie Joly, Minister of Economic Development and Official Languages, announced that businesses and organizations across Canada can now submit applications through the new Jobs and Growth Fund.⁷
 - The new fund provides \$700 million to support a regional response and stimulate economic recovery following the COVID-19 crisis by investing in projects that will help to create jobs over the next three years and beyond.
 - This includes up to \$70 million dedicated to businesses created after January 2020 that meet eligibility criteria.
 - Applications are being accepted on a continuous intake basis until March 31, 2024, or until funding is fully committed.
 - Eligible recipients include businesses (including co-operatives) and business support organizations, such as not-for-profit organizations, community economic development partners and Indigenous-led organizations and/or businesses.
 - Indigenous-led organizations and/or businesses may be eligible to receive up to 100 percent of eligible project costs.
