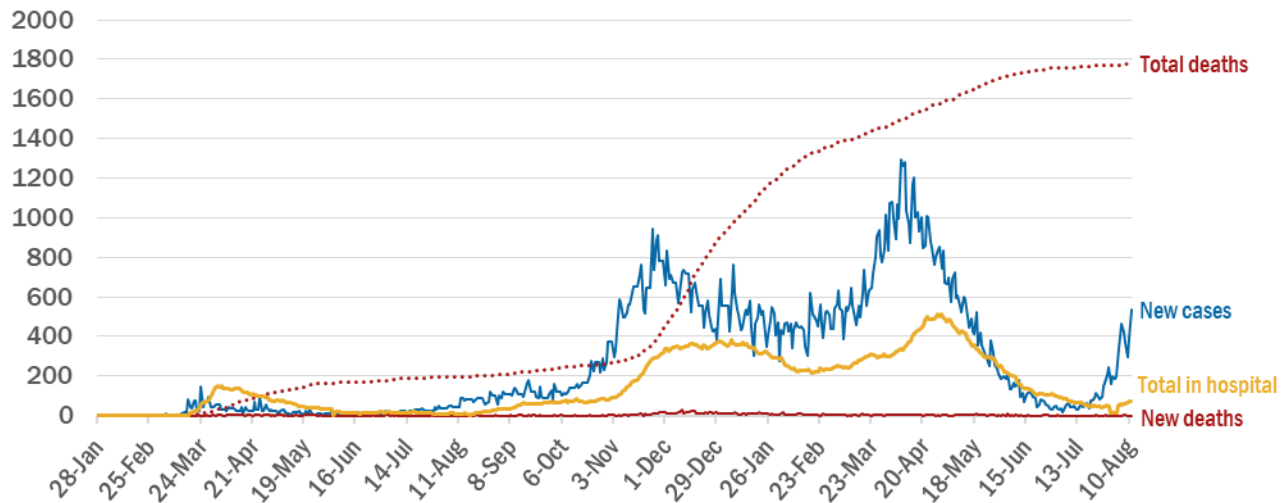

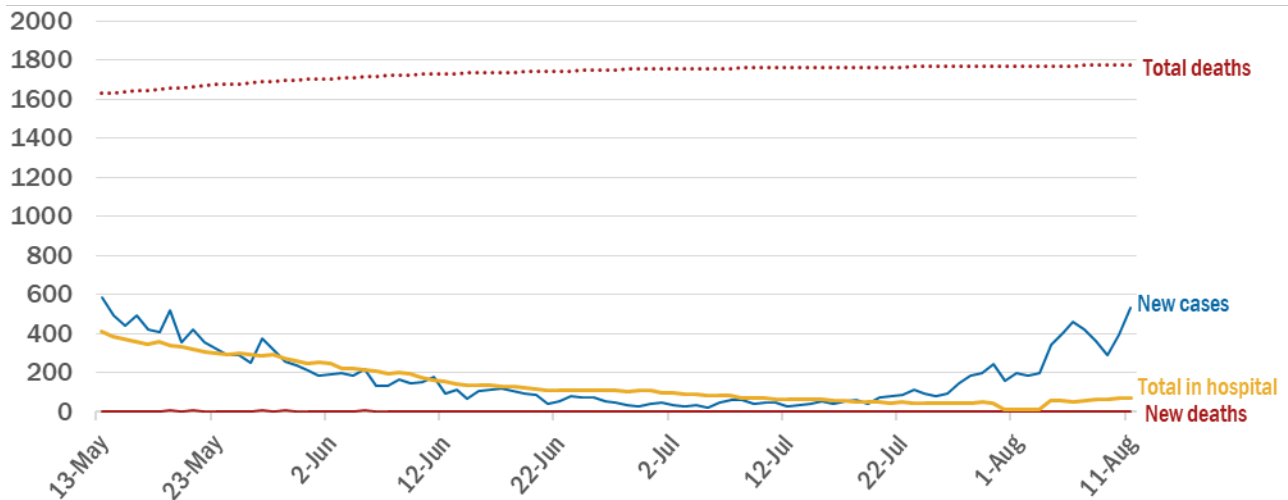

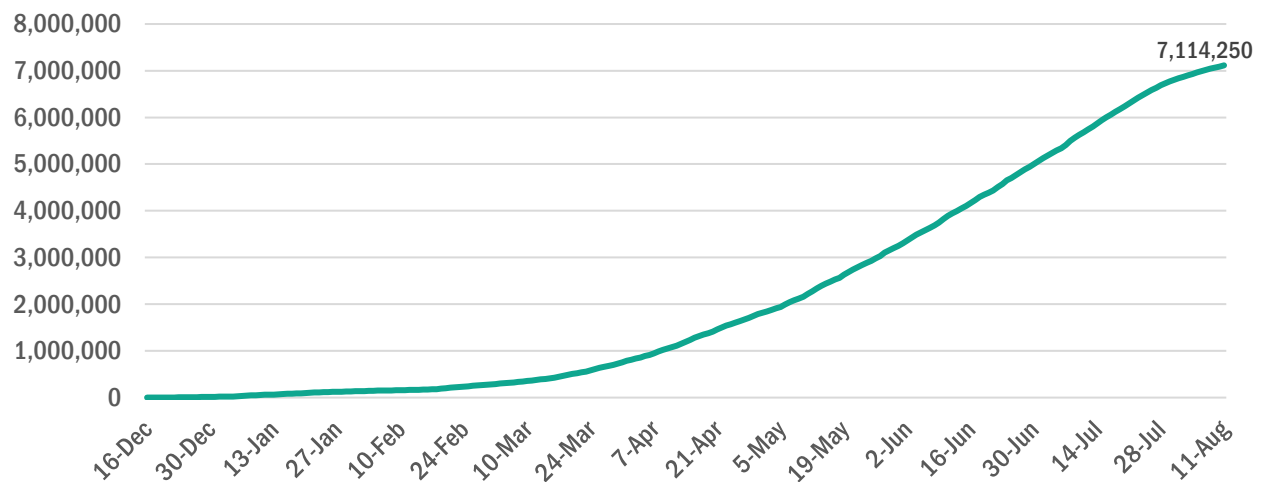

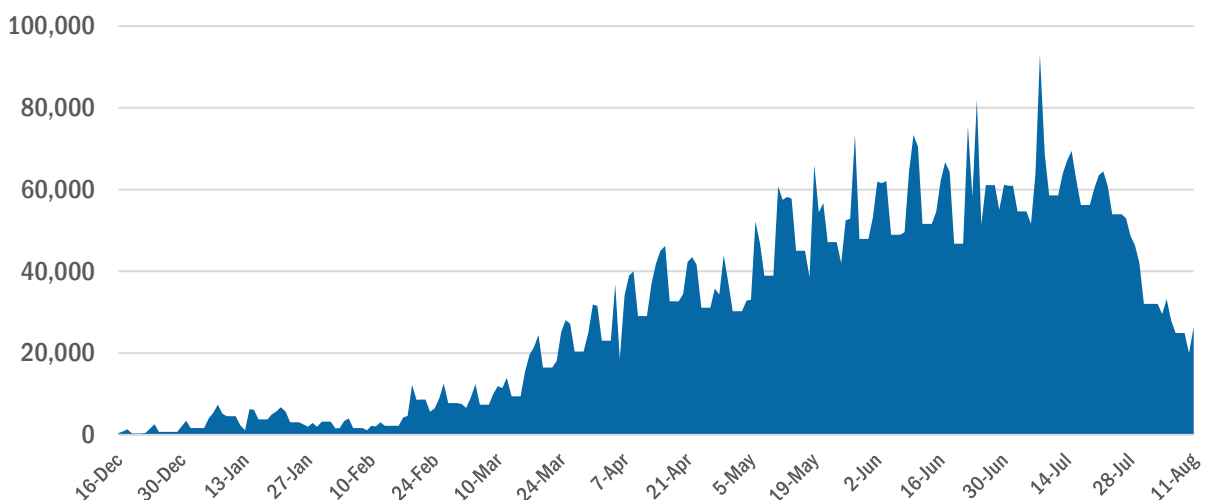

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN THE YUKON TERRITORY

- On August 10th, Dr. Jesse Kancir, Yukon’s Acting Chief Medical Officer of Health, reported three new cases of COVID-19 between August 9th at 12 p.m. and 12 p.m.⁵
 - The three new cases are located in Whitehorse.
 - COVID-19 public exposure notices have been issued for the following locations:
 - Kopper King Tavern on August 4th– 6th between 2 p.m. and 6:30 p.m.
 - Casa Loma Lounge on Thursday, August 5th between 12:30 p.m. and 3:00 p.m.

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

- Today, the Government of Canada announced that engagement is underway with provinces and territories to develop a National Proof of COVID-19 Vaccination Approach for international cross-border travel.⁶
 - The development of this approach will ensure Canadians:
 - Have access to their vaccination history to present to foreign border officials to assess whether the traveller meets public health requirements.
 - Have trusted and verifiable credentials when returning home.
 - Further information will be made available following the engagement process.
- Today, Dr. Theresa Tam, Chief Public Health Officer, released a statement regarding COVID-19 in Canada.⁷ Highlights include the following:
 - “With early signs of a Delta-driven wave beginning and the fall approaching, efforts to increase the proportion of fully vaccinated Canadians and reinforce individual precautions per local public health advice are crucial to reducing virus spread and lowering the risk of a resurgence that could lead to healthcare capacity being exceeded this coming fall and winter.”
 - “With recent increases in COVID-19 disease activity, we are closely monitoring the impact on lagging COVID-19 severity indicators and are seeing early signs that hospitalizations are increasingly slightly at the national level.”
 - “To this end, public health authorities continue to encourage uptake and administer first and second doses of COVID-19 vaccines to eligible people, aiming to achieve high vaccine coverage for widespread, stronger and longer lasting immunity across the Canadian population.”
