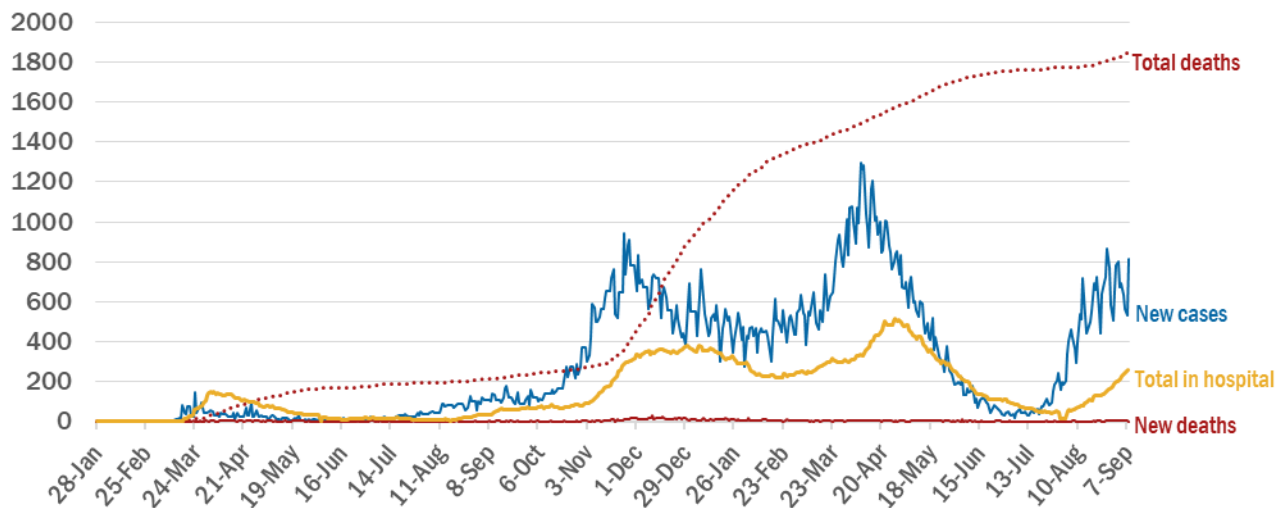

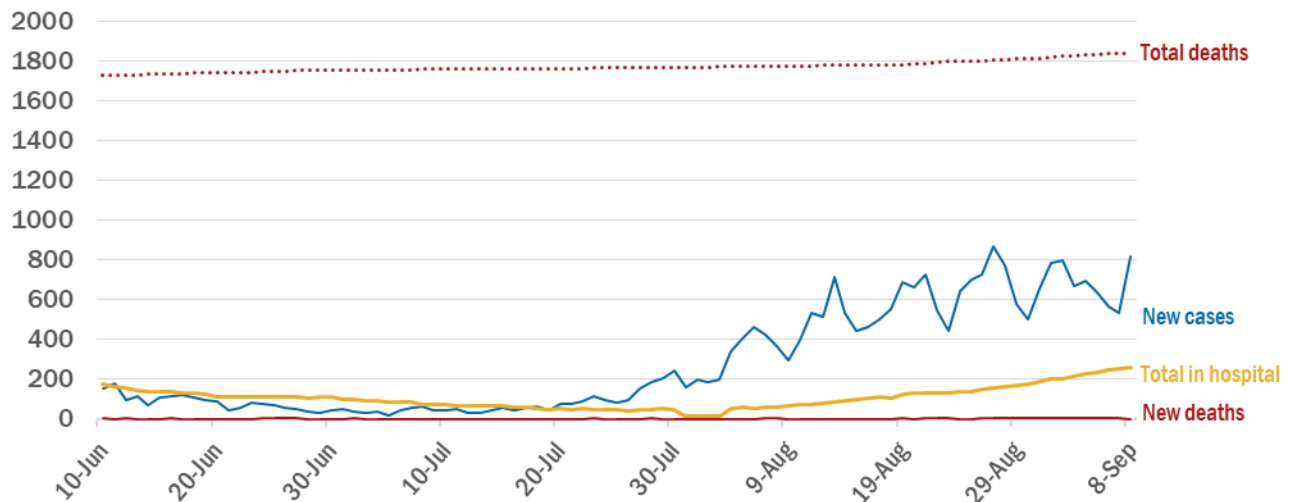

**COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN BC – PAST THREE MONTHS**



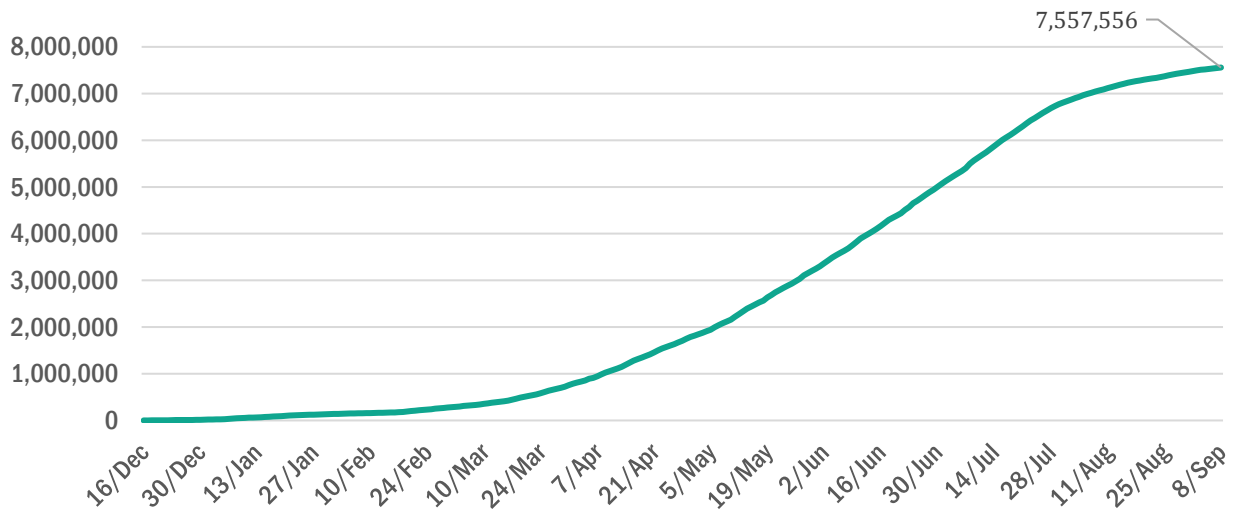

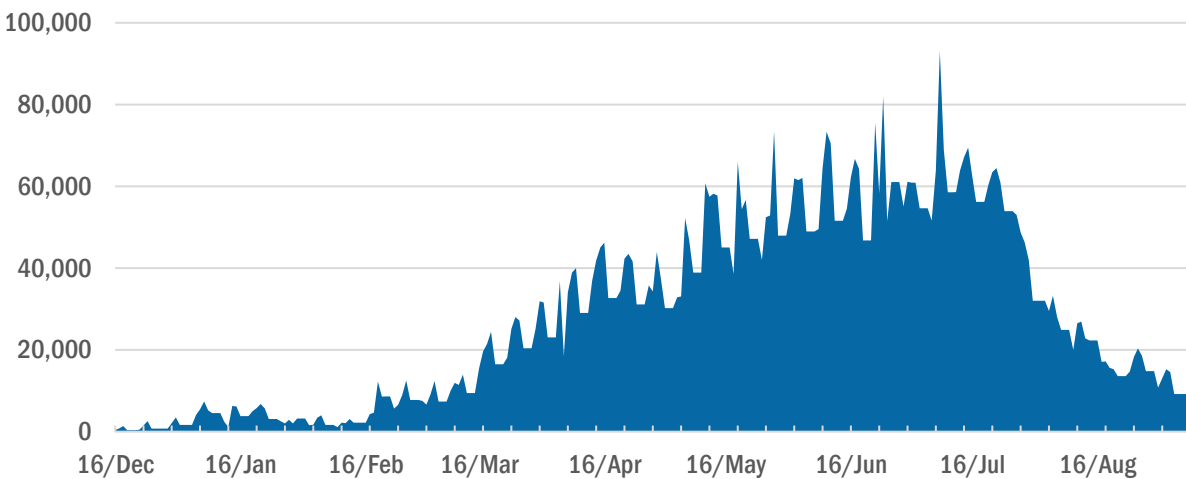

## SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

- Today, the First Nations Health Authority (FNHA) released a statement reinforcing details of the new BC Vaccine Card that will be implemented on September 13, 2021.<sup>5</sup> Highlights include the following:
  - The Vaccine Card system will require people in BC to provide proof of having at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine administered on or before August 31 when implemented on September 13.
  - By October 24, people in BC will be required to show proof of full vaccination (two doses).
  - The Vaccine Card can be obtained digitally and saved to a mobile device or printed out. Alternatively, residents can call the Provincial Vaccine Line at 1-833-838-2323 to have a printed card mailed directly or by visiting a Service BC Centre.
  - When arriving at a venue requiring proof of vaccination for entry, the BC Vaccine Card QR code will either be scanned or visually verified.
  - Some Indigenous communities have run their own clinics in partnership with the FNHA and filed the vaccination data with their regional health authorities which may not show up in the Provincial Immunization Registry (PIR).
    - If doses are missing from the online record, residents can ask the organization that provided the immunization to upload the information to [immunizationrecord.gov.bc.ca](https://immunizationrecord.gov.bc.ca) or by calling 1-888-268-4319.
    - Lost paper vaccination records can be accessed through the BC Health Gateway portal.
  - Proof of vaccination will not be required to vote in-person at the federal election advance polling or on Election Day (September 20).
- Today, the BC government released their daily report on vaccination statistics in the province, which included the following information:<sup>6</sup>
  - From Aug. 31-Sept. 6, people not fully vaccinated accounted for **77.8%** of all new COVID-19 cases in the province.
  - From Aug. 24-Sept. 6, people not fully vaccinated accounted for **85.9%** of hospitalizations in the province.

## SIGNIFICANT UPDATES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

- *A federal election was called on August 14 and scheduled for September 20; updates from the Government of Canada during this period may be limited and at a reduced frequency.*
- There are no significant updates from the Government of Canada today.
