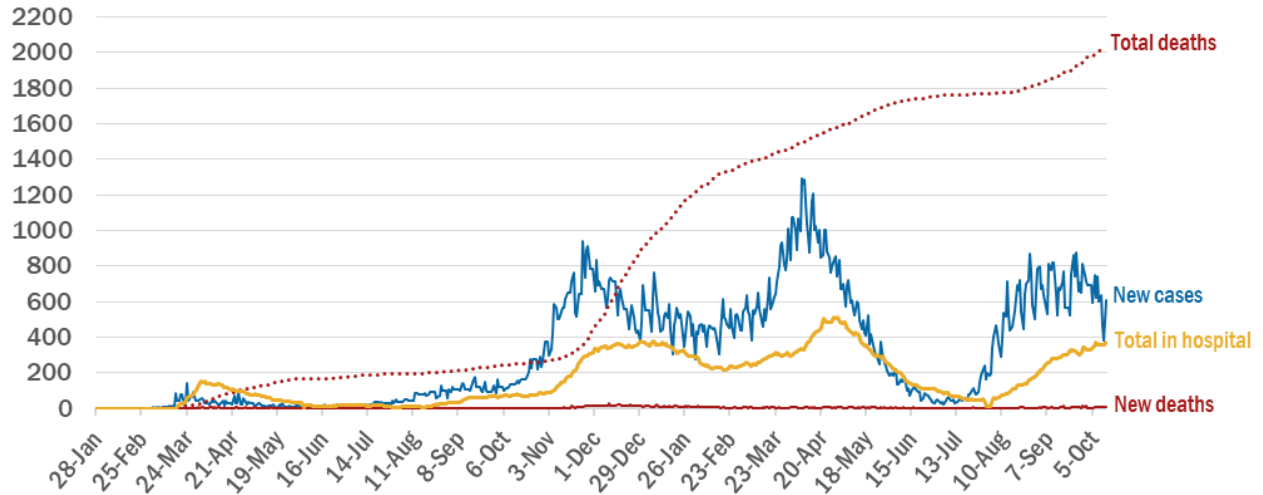

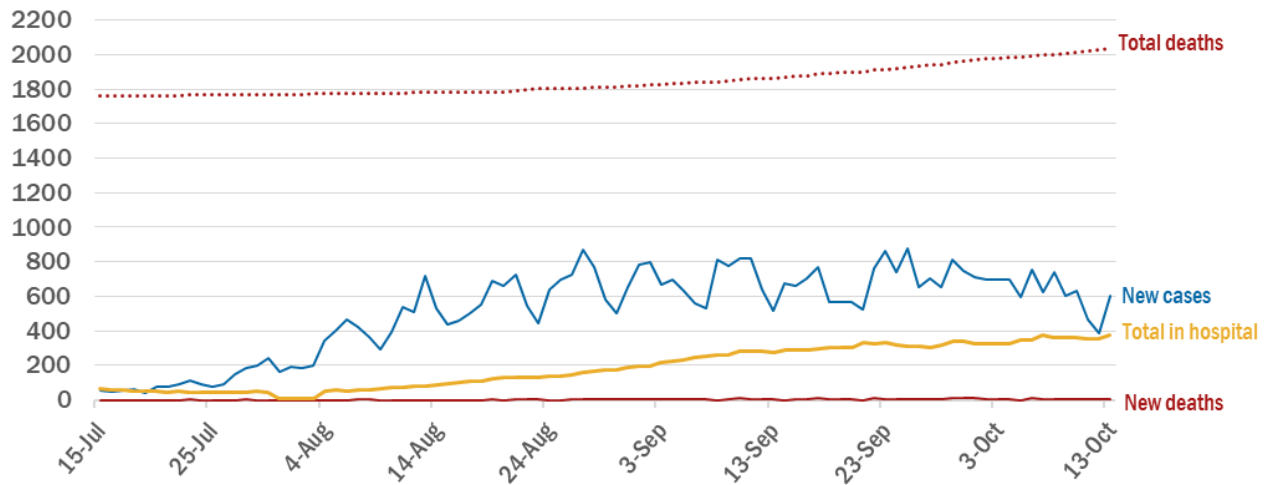

### COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN BC

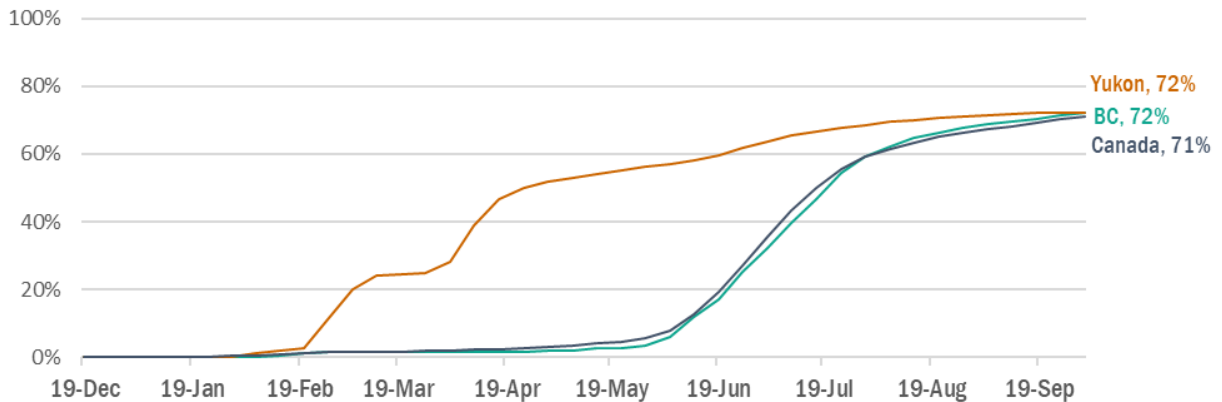


Note: Counts have been averaged where one number was reported for multi-day periods.

### COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN BC – PAST THREE MONTHS



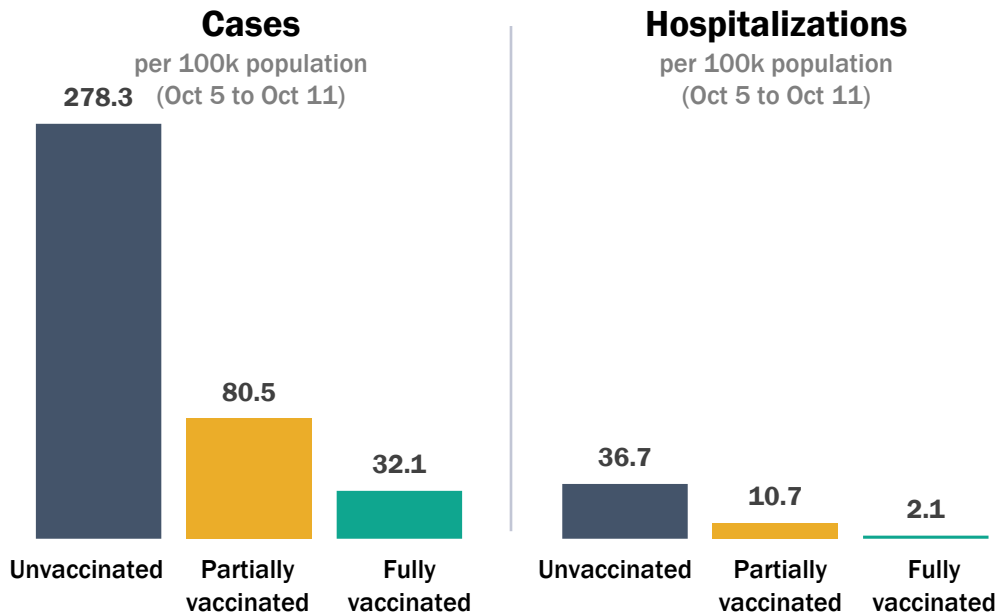
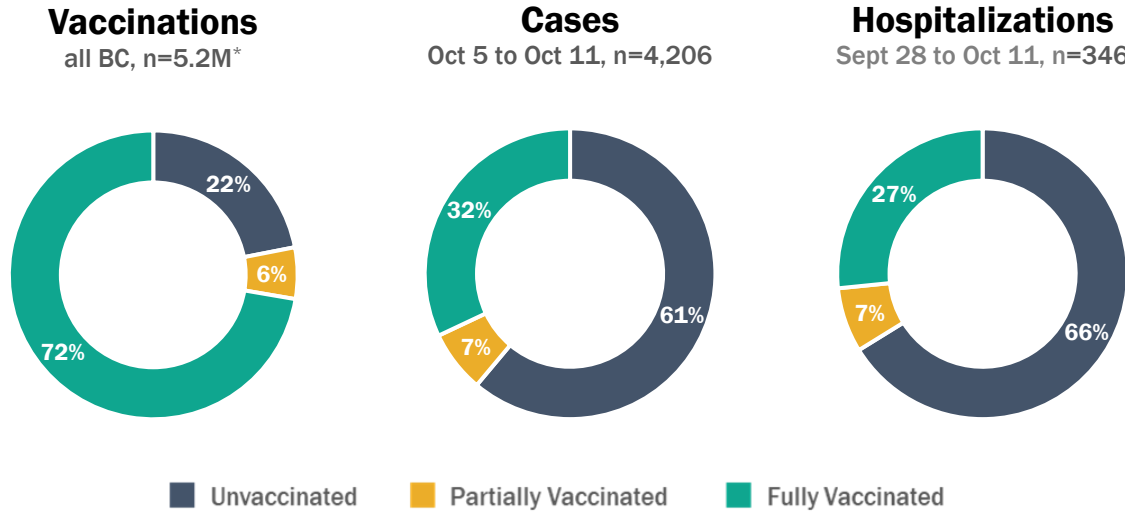
### CUMULATIVE % OF PEOPLE FULLY VACCINATED WITH A COVID-19 VACCINE<sup>4</sup>

## COVID-19 INFECTIONS IN B.C. BY VACCINATION STATUS

- From October 5 to October 11, 2021, people not fully vaccinated accounted for 68.0% of cases, and from September 28 to October 11, 2021, they accounted for 73.4% of hospitalizations.<sup>5,6</sup>

## SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

- Today, the Government of British Columbia released a COVID-19 update.<sup>7</sup>
  - In the past 24 hours, four new deaths have been reported, including three in Northern Health.

## SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN THE YUKON TERRITORY

- Today the Government of Yukon released the following COVID-19 public exposure notice.<sup>8</sup>
  - Air North flight: Whitehorse to Vancouver
  - Date: Tuesday, October 5, 2021
  - Departure: 3:30 p.m., arrival 5:45 p.m.
  - Flight: 4N569
  - If you were on this flight, self-monitor for symptoms until October 19, 2021. Get tested if you develop any symptoms.

## SIGNIFICANT UPDATES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

- Today, Bill Blair, Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness, issued the following statement on the re-opening of the U.S. land border for vaccinated Canadian travelers.<sup>9</sup> Details are as follows:
  - “The Government of Canada welcomes the news that the U.S. is opening its land border to vaccinated Canadian travelers starting in November.”
  - “We continue to closely monitor the progress of COVID-19 and will work with our partners in the U.S. to ensure the safety, security and well-being of our respective countries.”
  - “Though life is slowly returning to normal, it is important to remember that the pandemic is ongoing, and we must continue to take precautions and follow public health advice while traveling outside the country, as well as here at home, to ensure we finish the fight against COVID-19, rebuild our economy, and return to life as it was before.”
  - “We announced earlier this month that starting October 30, Canadians will need to be fully vaccinated to travel within Canada by plane, and by VIA Rail and Rocky Mountaineer trains.”
  - “We encourage all eligible Canadians who are not yet vaccinated to get vaccinated at their earliest availability.”
