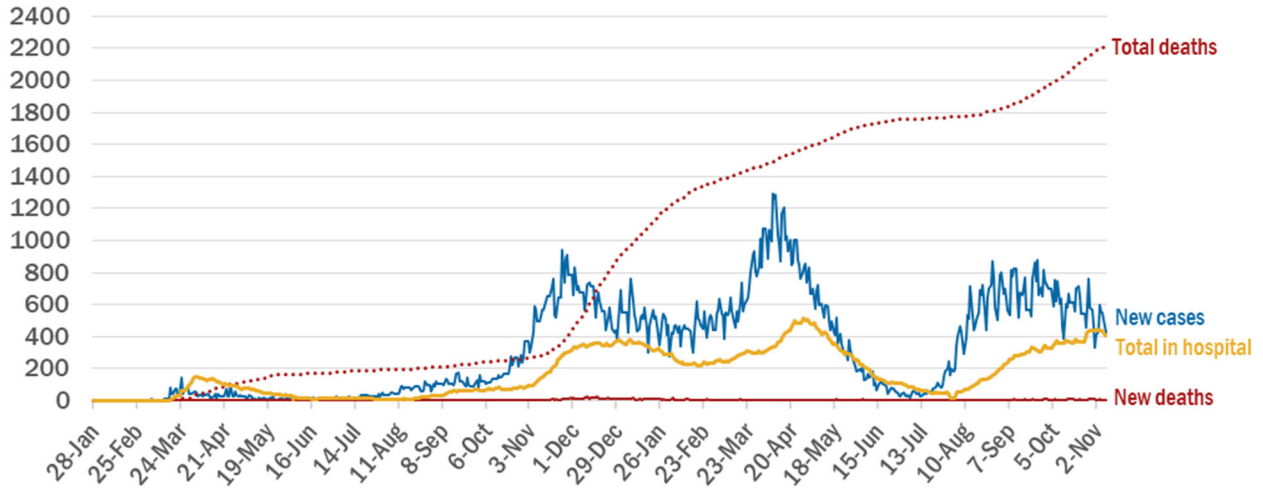

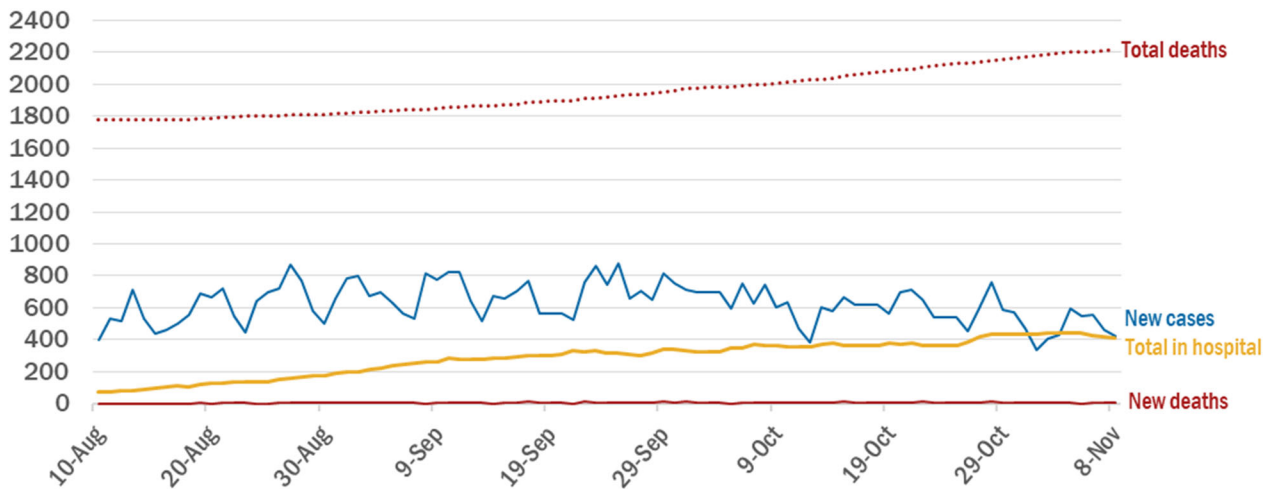

### COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN BC

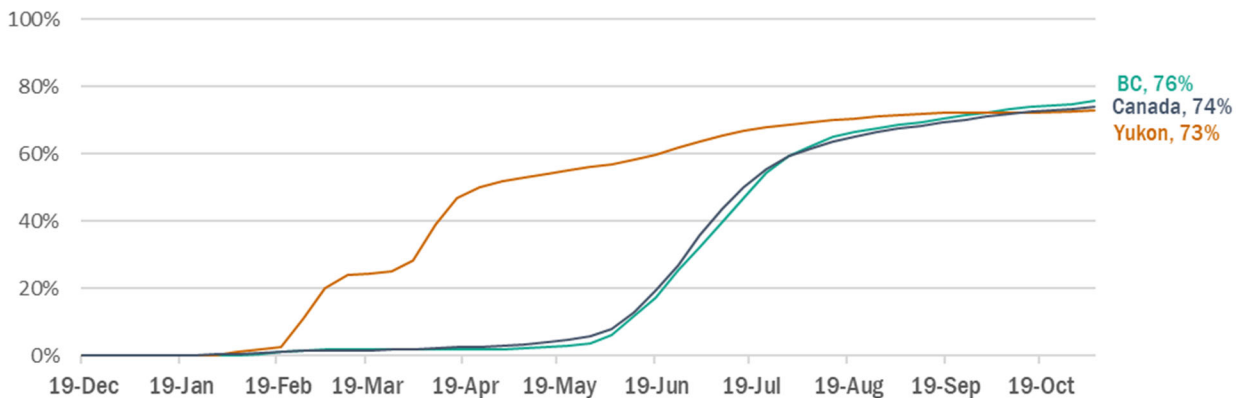


Note: Counts have been averaged where one number was reported for multi-day periods.

### COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN BC – PAST THREE MONTHS



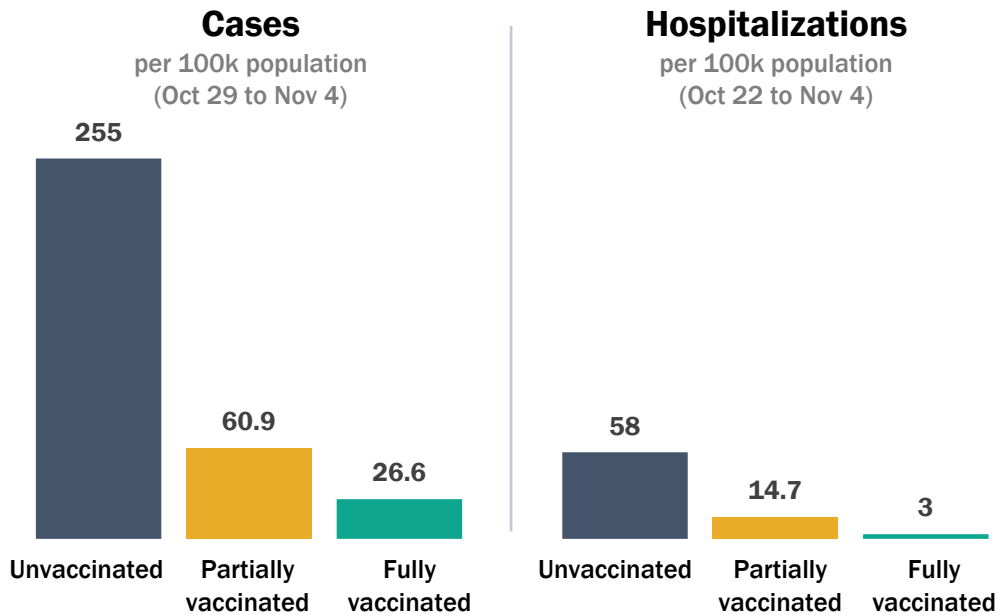
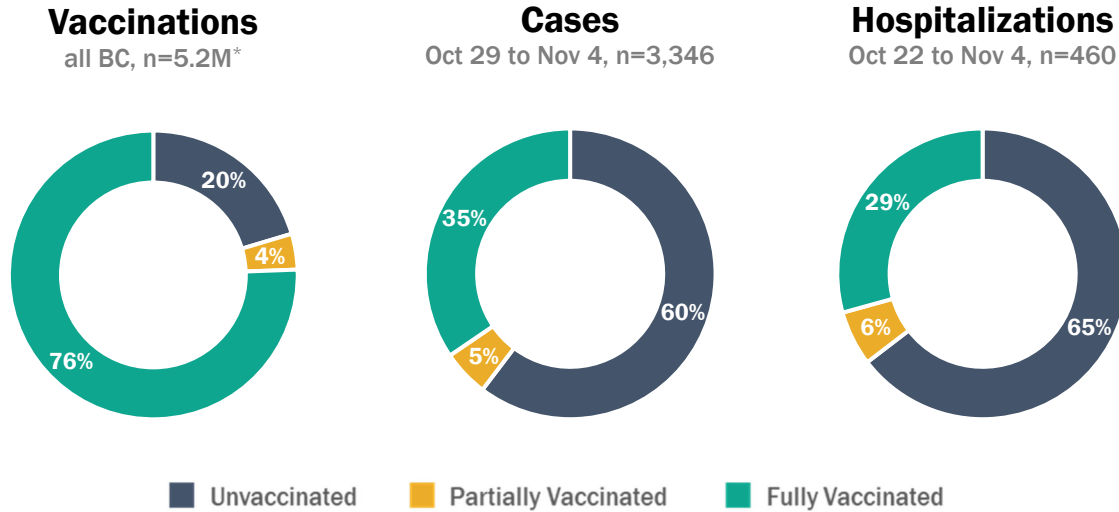
### CUMULATIVE % OF PEOPLE FULLY VACCINATED WITH A COVID-19 VACCINE<sup>4</sup>

## COVID-19 INFECTIONS IN B.C. BY VACCINATION STATUS

- From October 29 to November 4, 2021, people not fully vaccinated accounted for 65.5% of cases, and from October 22 to November 4, 2021, they accounted for 70.7% of hospitalizations.<sup>5,6</sup>

## SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN THE YUKON TERRITORY

- Today, the Yukon's acting Chief Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Catherine Elliott, announced that the COVID-19 situation in the Yukon is rapidly escalating and threatening the health care system.<sup>7</sup>

Details are as follows:

- "We are at a point in the pandemic that we have not been in before and one that we hoped we would not see. A rapidly escalating COVID-19 situation is developing in the Yukon and is threatening our health care system. We need to take immediate steps to break the cycle of widespread community transmission we are seeing right now and will likely continue to see over the coming days. It is more important than ever to get vaccinated and practise the Safe 6 plus 1."
- The Government of Yukon is considering new recommendations from the acting Chief Medical Officer of Health to act swiftly to help control the rapid spread of COVID-19 within the territory.
- Yukoners are urged to get vaccinated and practise the Safe 6 and are strongly encouraged to wear a mask in indoor public spaces.
- To help meet the increased demand for testing, **a drive-thru testing facility will begin on Wednesday, November 10, 2021.** Hours of operation are 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., 7 days per week. No appointment necessary. The drive-thru is located at 91628 Alaska Highway (Centennial Motors) in the wash bay. The facility will be open on November 11, 2021.
