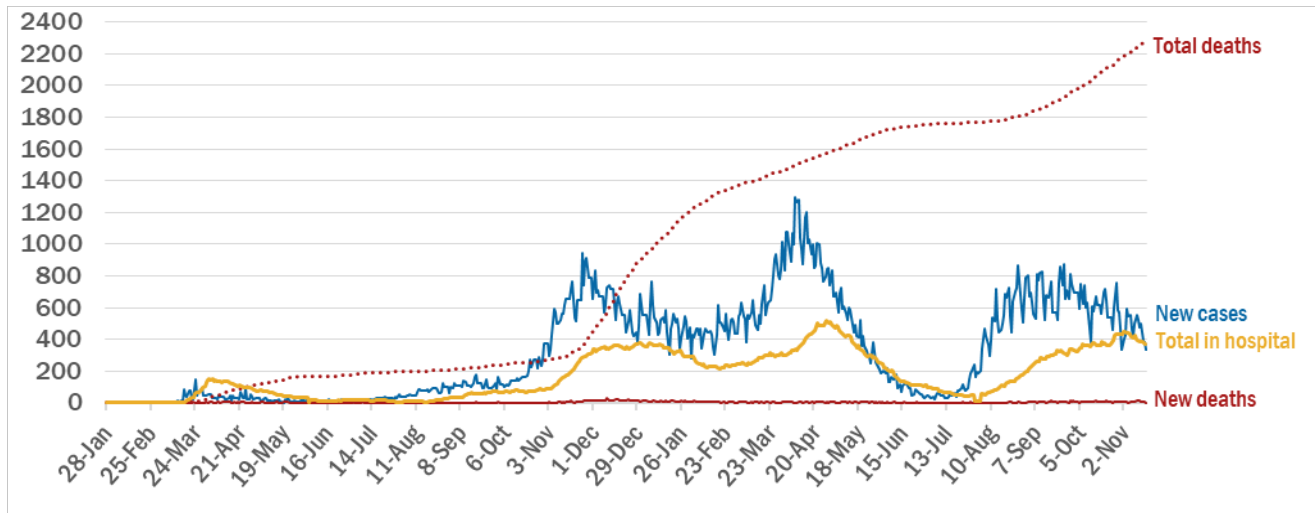

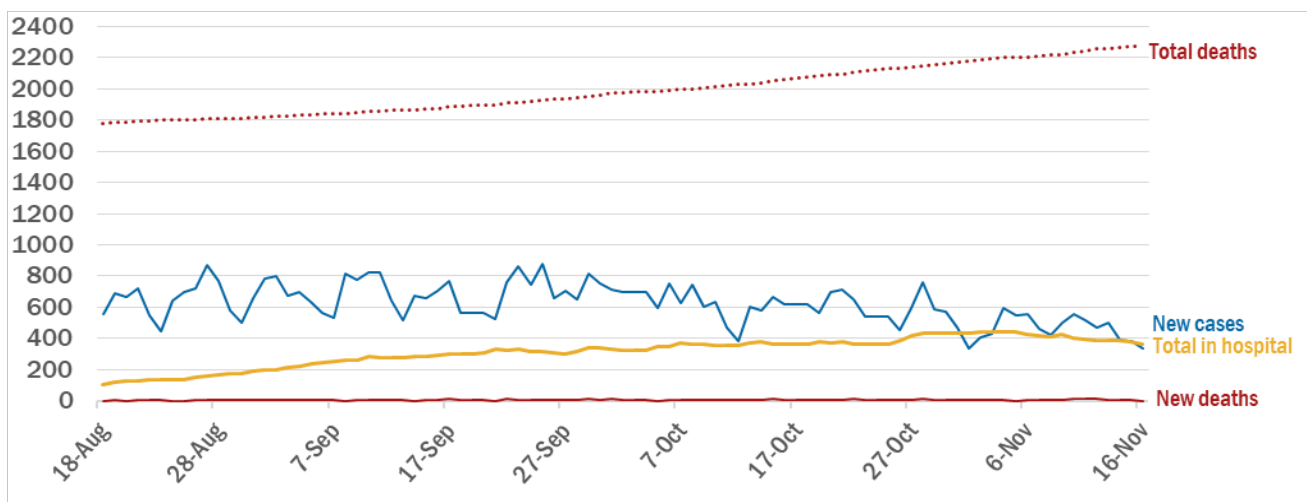

### COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN BC

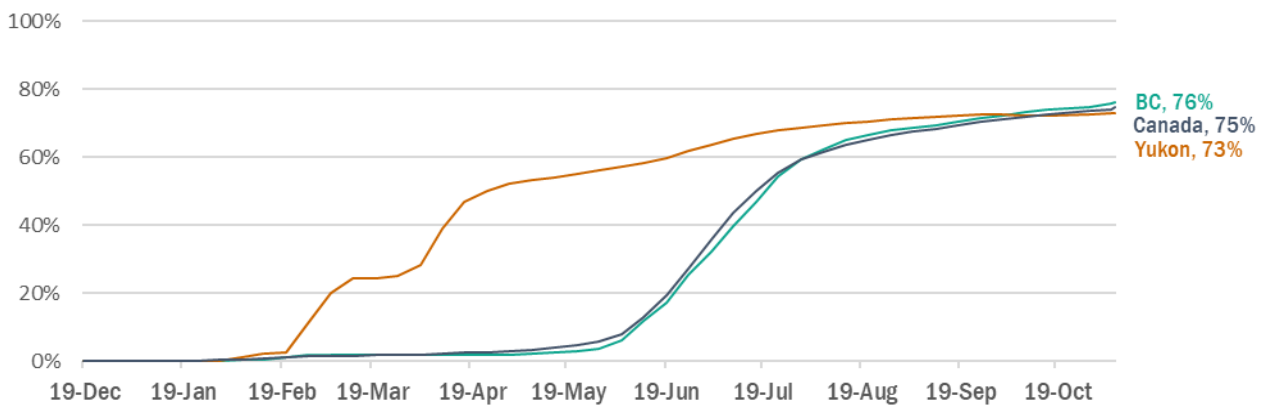


Note: Counts have been averaged where one number was reported for multi-day periods.

### COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN BC – PAST THREE MONTHS



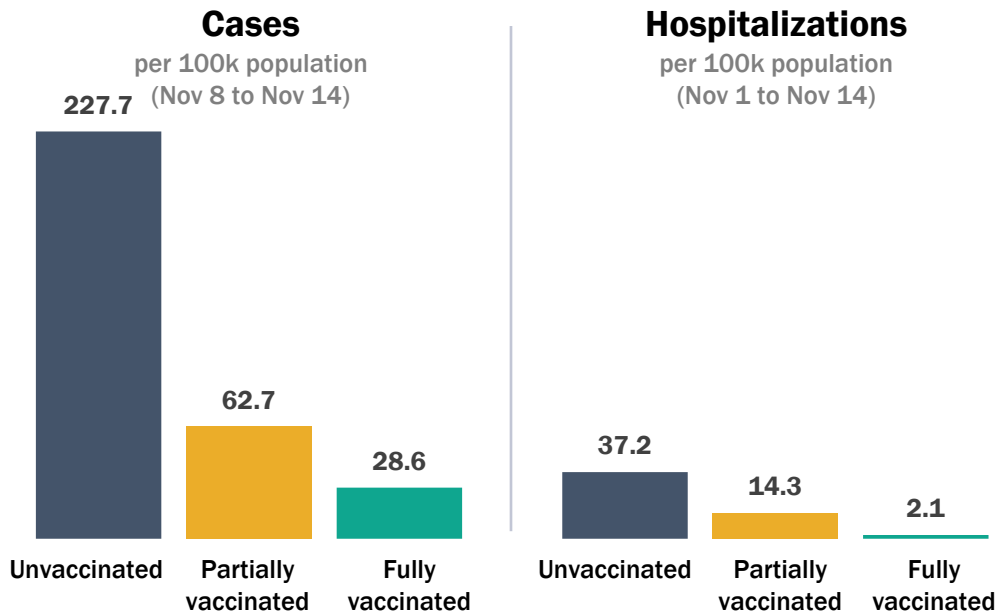
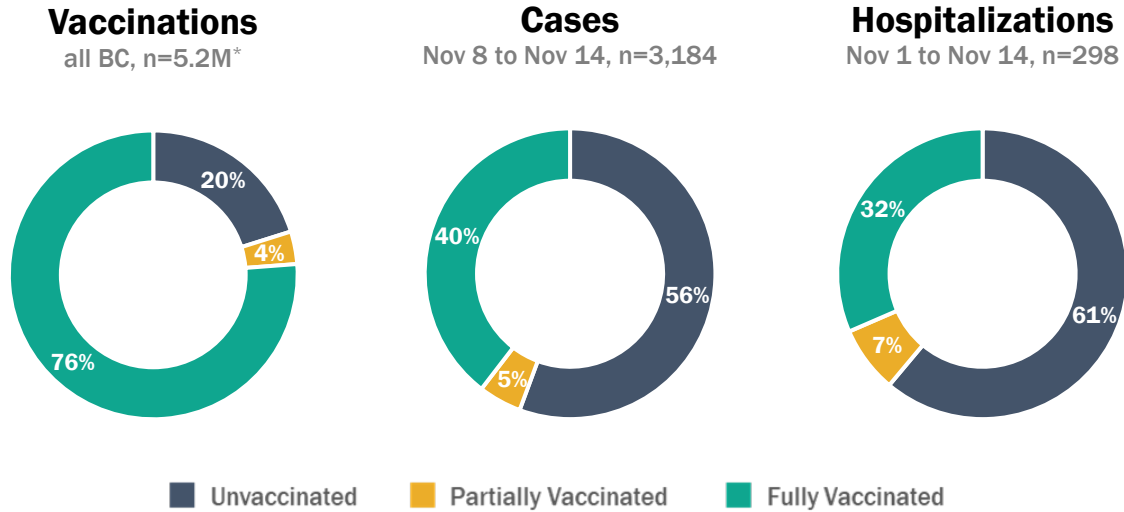
### CUMULATIVE % OF PEOPLE FULLY VACCINATED WITH A COVID-19 VACCINE<sup>4</sup>

## COVID-19 INFECTIONS IN B.C. BY VACCINATION STATUS

- From November 8 to November 14, 2021, people not fully vaccinated accounted for 60.5% of cases, and from November 1 to November 14, 2021, they accounted for 68.5% of hospitalizations.<sup>5,6</sup>

## SIGNIFICANT UPDATES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

- Today, Health Canada released a statement regarding Moderna’s submission seeking authorization to use the Spikevax COVID-19 vaccine in children between ages 6 and 11.<sup>7</sup> Highlights include the following:
  - “Today, Health Canada received a submission from Moderna seeking authorization for the use of its Spikevax COVID-19 vaccine in children 6 to 11 years of age.”
  - “Health Canada will only authorize the use of Spikevax in children if its independent and thorough scientific review of the data in the submission shows that the benefits of the vaccine outweigh the risks in this age group.”
  - “The assessment will include a detailed review of clinical trial results, as well as other evolving data and information about the health impacts of COVID-19 and variants of concern on children in Canada.”
  - “This is the second submission Health Canada has received for the use of a COVID-19 vaccine in this younger age group.”
    - “On October 18, 2021, Health Canada received a submission for the use of the Pfizer-BioNTech Comirnaty vaccine in children aged 5 to 11 years of age. The submission is currently under review.”
  - “Health Canada continues to closely monitor all safety and effectiveness data from real-world use of COVID-19 vaccines since their deployment in Canada and internationally.”
    - “This includes data on the use of the Pfizer-BioNTech Comirnaty vaccine in children 5 to 11 years of age where it has already been authorized for use.”
  - “Studies with the Moderna Spikevax vaccine are ongoing in children less than 6 years of age, and other manufacturers are also testing their vaccines in children of various age ranges. Health Canada expects to receive data for different age groups for review in the coming months.”
