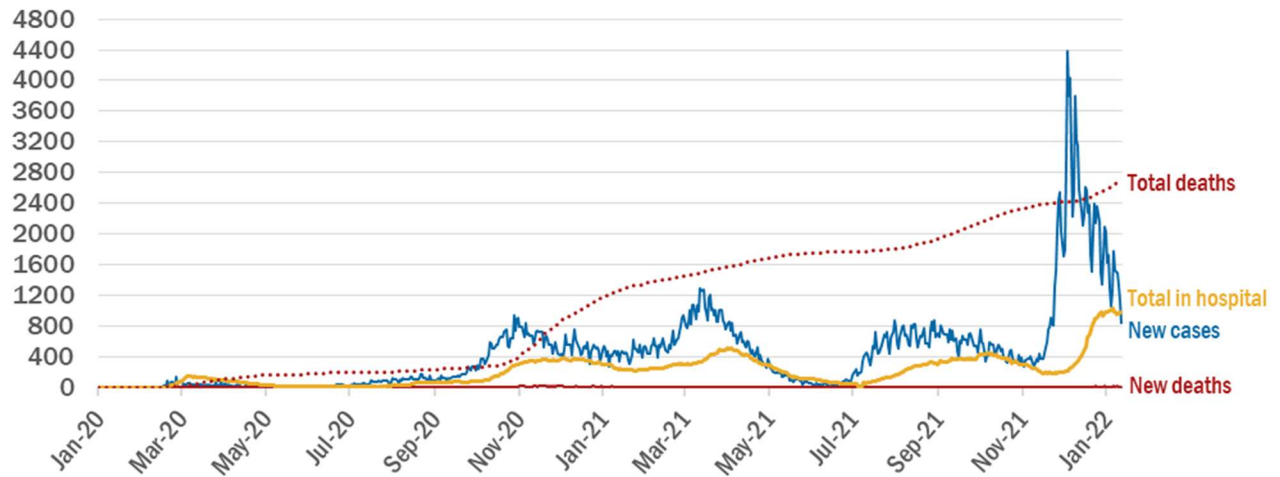

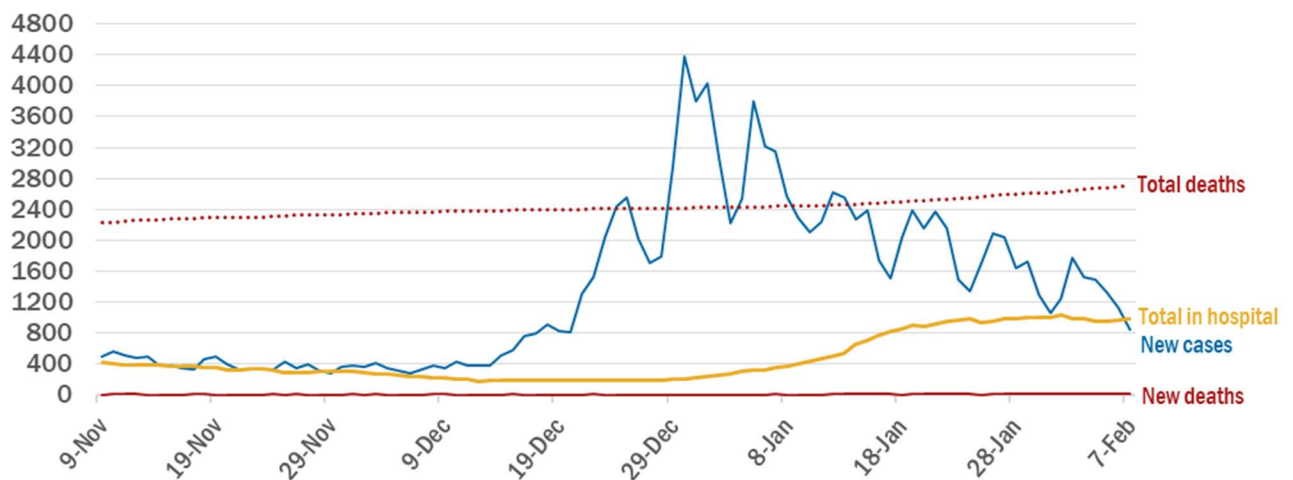

### COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN BC

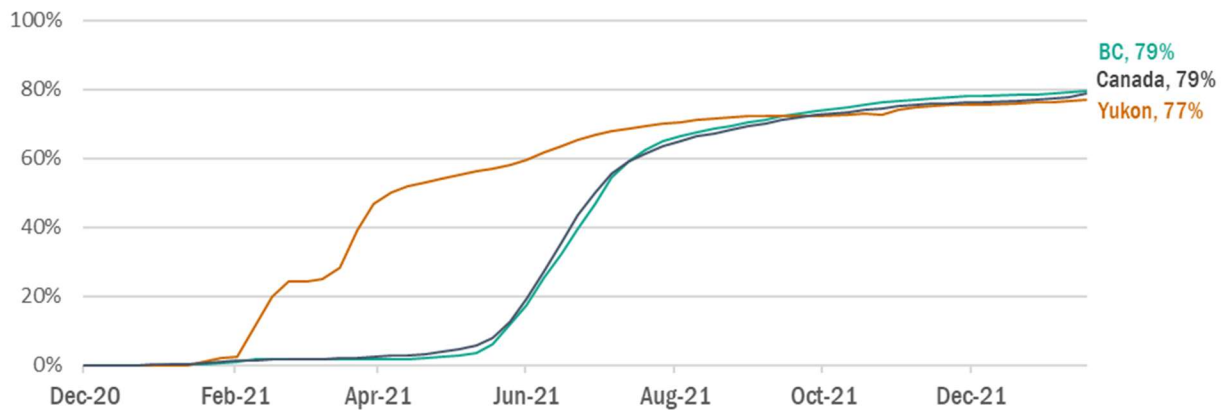


Note: Counts have been averaged where one number was reported for multi-day periods.

### CUMULATIVE % OF PEOPLE FULLY\* VACCINATED WITH A COVID-19 VACCINE<sup>4</sup>

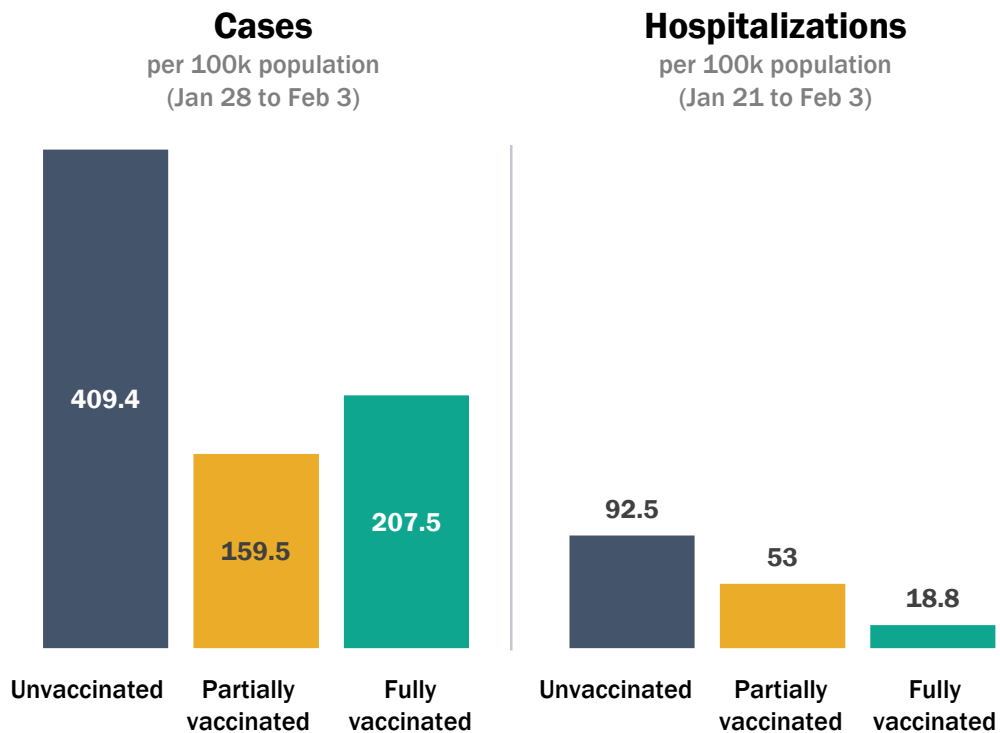
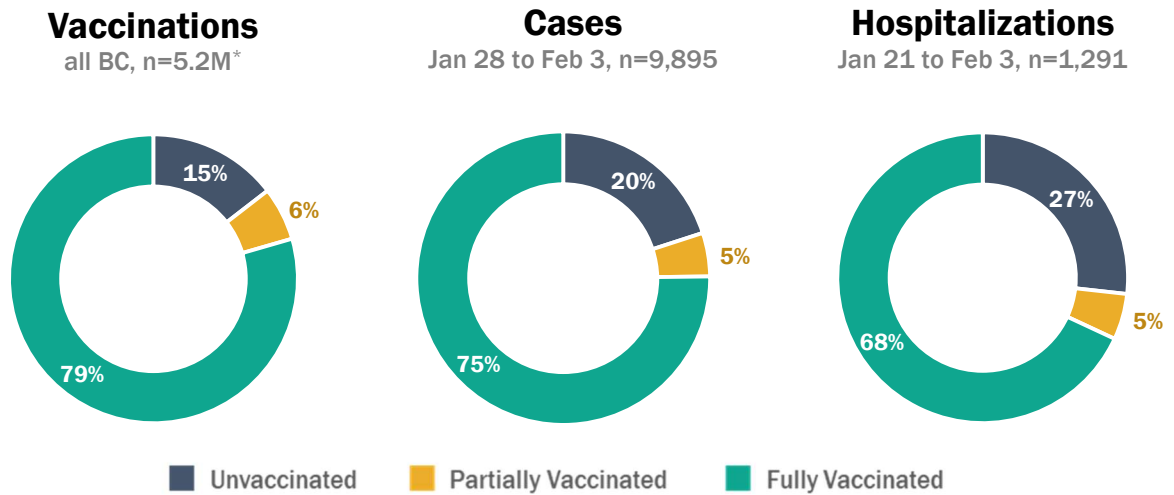


\*People who have received 2 doses of Pfizer, Moderna, and AstraZeneca or 1 dose of Janssen are considered **fully** vaccinated.

## COVID-19 INFECTIONS IN B.C. BY VACCINATION STATUS

- From January 28, 2022, to February 3, 2022, people not fully vaccinated accounted for 24.8% of cases, and from January 21 to February 3, they accounted for 31.9% of hospitalizations.<sup>5,6</sup>

## **SIGNIFICANT UPDATES IN BRITISH COLUMBIA**

- Today, the Ministry of Children and Family Development announced additional health and safety funding for childcare providers.<sup>7</sup> Highlights include the following:
  - “The province is investing \$20 million in one-time grants to help licensed childcare providers meet the challenges of additional pandemic-related health and safety costs, while also supporting access to inclusive, quality and affordable childcare.”
  - “These funds can be used to buy cleaning supplies, sanitizer or masks, to hire an external company to clean, or additional staff to cover absences due to illness and to meet local needs.”
  - “Licensed providers who are open and regularly receiving provincial funding will get a grant of \$160 per space based on the facility’s maximum capacity.”
  - “The grants will be issued in early to mid-February and will support providers for the coming year.”
  - “Most recently, the province announced that childcare facilities that are receiving CCOF from the B.C. government would receive 250,000 rapid antigen tests to support health and safety.”
